President Sternin called the meeting to order at 6:21 pm. The Pledge and a Moment of Silence was observed.

2.0 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

3.0 NEW/OLD BUSINESS

Trustee Kristin Schmutzler commented on looking at budgeted advisory team, next year budget will include the capital improvement. Do we want to think about bringing back a team where there is an open forum and different people?

President Heather Sternin responded that her feeling is being on the committee, when this first started, the committee didn't contribute a whole lot. Questions weren't asked, the group didn't really contribute. Feel like the committees were designed pre tax cap, during a period of time when the tax payer groups were coming out. With the tax cap, the things those committees do aren't needed as much. Didn't see a whole lot of anything come out of those meetings. Referred to Dan, met with some of those groups before.

Trustee Dan Calabrese: His observations were that it started up years and years ago, brought up to hopefully bring people on for them to learn about it. Those people came on, they wanted their opinions in the budget itself, but it doesn't work that way. The committee is a double edged sword.

Trustee Alicia O'Donnell said that the tax cap makes sense, a lot of tax payers don't come to the meetings, maybe positive communication to get the information out might help people get involved. President Heather Sternin said maybe the info can get out without a committee, can brain storm on ideas. Working harder to get people to come to meetings. A lot of people running for the board, are a part of PTA, maybe communicate that way.

Vice President Danielle Opalinski added that she was on that committee before becoming a board member. There were community members, most didn't show up. It was also comprised of two parents including herself and she was the only one that came. There were some political people, and teachers. All meetings about the budget are public session, it's about getting them here to get the information. President Heather Sternin said people who are interested can come without being on a committee, you choose two people to be on a committee, but 10 might come if you let them know it's happening. Put the word out on the website, push notifications, there's no newspaper so it doesn't go out that way. I don't know how else to get the word out, I don't think a budget advisory team is the way to do it.

Vice President Danielle Opalinski said being a community member, there was another man that came often, he wanted things done. When you are sitting out there, you don't know what could happen. He thought he could make a change. As a community member, it was a waste of time, wasn't valued. Very clear that we meant nothing, different administration back then.

President Heather Sternin said that we can look into a vote, if someone wanted to propose a motion. Trustee Elizabeth Koch said Donna does an exceptional job, anyone who is interested in how things are spent, you only have to show up to a board meeting, She makes it easy, concise, she does a great job. Trustee Jeff Thorp said he thinks we have to reach out more, he likes the idea, but from what's being said, it doesn't sound like it would work out.

Trustee Kristin Schmutzler said she was on the committee before, the invite caused interest and she got to learn, liked the conversation and transparency, nice to see teachers, and hear input. It happened a half hour before the regular meeting, more conversation. No more extensive than how we are meeting, talked about the budget, and had transparency, communication to teachers and community members. It could be a reminder for people that \$100 will be showing from the project, it's important to get that information out. Didn't realize until she sat on that committee that any of it was being shared, you don't know until you see it.

President Heather Sternin said she is willing to guess that even though you had the committee, the amount of people voting, didn't change. Understand that you gained an interest, but you are that type

of person who looks for opportunities to learn grow and move things along. I have no problem with people coming in and coming to the microphone, talk about agenda items, come in, say something, give us your opinion. But to select a few, it's not getting the community involved.

Trustee Alicia O'Donnell would love for people to come to the meetings and communicate, she agrees no one comes. She is looking at it like public relations. With knowing that bigger bill is coming, personal thought, Dr. Oldenburg is great about getting stakeholder input, as a parent, I was able to go out, was on an interview board, had the opportunity to talk to parent peers, and new principal, looking at it through that lens, get some positive communication and PR about the increase.

President Heather Sternin said she would like to see info go out in a different way. Most district aren't working with those teams or committees anymore. Can make a motion if that's what you want to do, can do now or later. Don't want to break down continuing talking about it.

Trustee Alicia O'Donnell said can it be tabled for now and can brainstorm some ideas in the mean-time. With the current system, people don't pay attention, some other ideas how to communicate that out would be great.

President Heather Sternin said people get caught up in their daily lives. When people are happy with how things are going, they don't come out, they are happy with the programs, it's when something is out, that you get a push. Would love to see community members, not just teachers, love seeing teachers, but would love to see community members, I don't think the budget advisory team is the way to do it.

Trustee Alicia O'Donnell said people don't come until they are upset, if we can head up that upset that would be great.

President Heather Sternin said lets come up with other methods of communication and get the info out.

Trustee Kristin Schmutzler reported that it was very cool to see the elementary school come along, seeing the little changes, very excited for teachers to see it when it's completed, it is exciting. Congrats to student athletes, thank you Donna for presentation and thank you Amy. Planning legislative things that might be on the table, which ones to push and advocate for. Big topic was the electric busses coming out. Not something we have to worry about, but huge topic and concerns about those. Not surprised seeing some questions or concerns on the next legislative round from ECASB and NYSBAA, bigger undertaking and serious concerns.

Trustee Elizabeth Koch echoed Trustee Schmutzler comments as well, congrats to scholar athletes, and thank you to school nurses for all that they do. Go out and vote May 17^{th} and support the budget.

Trustee Jeff Thorp reported that teacher appreciation was last week, thank you teachers. Tour of the site was great, really excited to see the finished project, weird to see it where it is, but it will be impressive. Thank you to Amy for all of your work, dealing with his own kids, been an

amazing process. Congrats to the athletes, and thanks for the letter to have people reaching out.
