


#### Frankfort Independent School District

Milestone 1 – Each and every child will be reading and writing at proficient and advanced levels by 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade.


Milestone 2 – Each and every child will be performing at proficient and advanced levels in Reading, Writing, and Math by 8<sup>th</sup> Grade.

# Frankfort Independent Schools Tax Exempt Property Challenge

- 1. 75% of FIS Property is tax exempt
- 2. 96.5 is our tax rate (high)
- 3. We operate on a 10.5 million dollar budget
- 4. FIS loses 6 million dollars a year on potential revenue which equates to 3 million dollars after giving back local effort in SEEK
- 5. Buildings and learning spaces have suffered as a result (constantly in survival mode).

# Tax Exempt Property Challenge - Progress

- 1. Passed Recallable Equalized Nickel (September 2016) (Equalized at 25% based on 2018 legislation)
- 2. Recallable Equalized Nickel moved bonding capacity from 1.2 million dollars to over 4.6 million dollars and will eventually be more than 7.5 million dollars.
- 3. Working closely with Executive and Legislative partners to determine budget language and in lieu support.
- 4. Downtown Frankfort redevelopment including Parcel B (supports from City of Frankfort and Col. Landrum) critical to FIS taxable property opportunities.

# Tax Exempt Property Challenge - Next Steps

- 1. Recallable Equalized Nickel needs to be equalized at 100% (2020).
- 2. Budget language needs to be included in next budget for the Commonwealth (focused on in-lieu support that is permanent and significant). Example language: Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, the Finance and Administration Cabinet shall pay District #177 an amount equal to 25% of the basic SEEK appropriation paid to the district each fiscal year from funds which would have otherwise lapsed to compensate for tax exempt state property.
- 3. Urgent Needs Money Request (Legislative support)
- 4. Ramp up involvement to ensure Downtown Frankfort redevelopment including Parcel B focuses on taxable property opportunities.

- 1. STEM+ Lab (Mr. Rosen willing to donate up to \$100,000 with a 1:1 match for STEM+ Lab)
- 2. Profile of an FIS Graduate (Metrics and Milestones at each level of mastery and completion)
- 3. GEAR-UP Grant (recently selected to participate in 7 Year Grant focused on college and career readiness)
- 4. Upgraded learning spaces and full renovations of Second Street School and Frankfort High School
- 5. Nursing Pathway and Lab at FHS
- 6. Increase Career and Technical Education offerings (including electrician pathway, construction trades, etc.)
- 7. Ramp up robotics, academic teams, chorus, arts, and offerings for each and every child.

# Frankfort Independent Schools Connected Community School

**Objective 2 – Connected Community School** 

Goal: Cultivate and grow partnerships with community organizations, city and state officials, businesses, families, local universities, and churches to provide a sustainable system of support focused on a 3:1 approach for each and every child.

## Frankfort Independent Schools Connected Community School-Progress

- 1. Increased Enrollment Significantly (720 in 2015 to 900 in 2018)
- 2. KSU/FIS Partnership focused on Teaching and Learning, Early College, STEM + Pathways, Kenan Grant (\$400,000), Mentoring, and Equity
- 3. Kentucky Counseling Center Counseling and social/emotional supports for all students and families in FIS (KCC centers located in each school)
- 4. Partnership with the City of Frankfort (\$200,000) focused on enhancing learning opportunities for each and every child (internet access, improved technology infrastructure in the schools, and branding/marketing support)
- 5. Collaboration with the City of Frankfort on the TIGER GRANT
- 6. Partnership with Johns Hopkins University and Dr. Jonathan Plucker focused Talent Development Plan and Excellence Gaps
- 7. Partnership with Kings Center to support after school programming for students

### Frankfort Independent Schools Connected Community School – Next Steps

- 1. Elevate partnerships with Kings Center, Cooperative Extension Centers, YMCA, Paul Sawyier Public Library, and other local partners to support robust after school programming for increased learning opportunities (apply for 21st Century Learning Grant)
- 2. Create a community maker space lab focused on STEM + opportunities for students, community members, workforce development, and adult training and learning.
- 3. Ramp up branding/marketing/communication to support livable, workable community surrounding FIS.
- 4. Communicate Profile of an FIS Graduate to all community shareholders and stakeholders
- 5. Involve alumni and community in supporting overhaul of athletic and academic facilities.

# Frankfort Independent Schools Enhanced Human Capital

**Objective 3 - Enhanced Human Capital Performance** 

Goal: Recruit, develop, grow, retain, and reward a world-class workforce that reflects our population.

# Frankfort Independent Schools Enhanced Human Capital-Progress

- 1. KSU Partnership focused on grant supporting teaching and learning pathway.
- 2. Onboarding Committee in the process of developing "The Frankfort Way" for Frankfort Independent Schools teachers, staff, and employees.
- 3. Rich Rosen donation of \$100,000 focused on five (5) \$2000 scholarships per year for 10 years for teacher quality improvement in professional growth and learning.
- 4. Professional Development support for our staff through early release days as well as personalized professional growth plans and support (PLCs, CTEPS, etc.)

- 1. Partner with the City of Frankfort and developers on enticing teachers and staff to move to Frankfort to live and work in the community

# Frankfort Independent Schools 21<sup>st</sup> Century Technology and Facilities – Next Steps

- 1. Major upgrades and renovations to Second Street School and Frankfort High School to support 21<sup>st</sup> Learning Opportunities (pathways and passions)
- 2. Overhaul of technology hardwire infrastructure at all school sites (\$200,000)
- 3. Major renovations to all athletic facilities with laser focus on Sower Field Complex and FD Wilkinson Gym

- 1. Provides a high quality education
- Integrated into the fabric of the community and encourages community involvement
- 3. Small enough to ensure safe and successful learning environments for all students
- 4. Rich in tradition yet agile enough for innovation

- 1. Improve the City of Frankfort by creating robust learning experiences.
- 2. Provide opportunities for our students that fit their passion areas.
- 3. Offer innovative learning spaces and buildings that promote teaching and learning at a high level.
- 4. Reimagine our athletic facilities to invite the entire community to use and participate in healthy living experiences.
