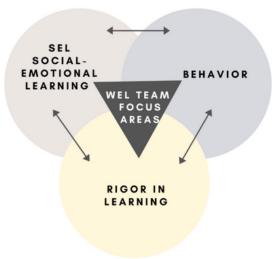


## EQUITY JOURNEY AT WAHLUKE SCHOOL DISTRICT
