Dear Orrington Staff, Students, and Families

09/10/2021

We received notice from the Maine Center for Disease Control (MCDC) that the Center Drive School (CDS) has been identified as having an official COVID-19 outbreak. This MCDC designation means three people associated with the school have had a case over a fourteen day time period. We have recently been notified of a fourth positive case. Any contact tracing has happened. Our total number of people required to be out due to being in close contact is lower than it would have been last year thanks to vaccination and universal masking rules in place this year. Masking doesn't eliminate all quarantining, but it has reduced it at every school in AOS 47.

A school representative would have contacted you directly if your child was identified as a close contact of someone who tested positive. Where the school currently has qualified as an outbreak status, only close contacts who are vaccinated will continue to be able to attend school. Once the state authorizes our application for Pool Testing, those students participating in pool testing would be able to stay as well. During an outbreak, the Maine CDC does not allow the masking exemption.. An outbreak is removed once we have gone 28 days without a positive case. A negative test result does not allow an individual not to quarantine. Here is information on what it means to [be in quarantine](#). A student who is in quarantine is eligible for school meals, please call 825-3697 before 9:00 if you are interested.

While we have seen school districts around the state going remote for days to stop the spread of this Delta variant, Center Drive School continues to remain open for in-person education at this time. I will update you should anything change. We continue to follow CDC guidelines to ensure that we educate as many students as possible safely and in-person at CDS. Please monitor yourself/your student for signs and symptoms with our [Pre-Screening Tool](#). Call a health care provider if symptoms start. COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that ranges from mild to severe. It can be more severe in adults 60 years and older and in those with underlying conditions. The virus mainly spreads when an

infected person coughs or sneezes and an uninfected person breathes in the virus. Signs and symptoms include: • fever or chills • cough • shortness of breath or difficulty breathing • fatigue • muscle or body aches • headache • new loss of taste or smell • sore throat • congestion or runny nose • nausea or vomiting • diarrhea • confusion • pressure or pain in the chest • blue/gray-tinged skin/lips/nail beds • inability to wake or stay awake. Please keep in mind that many things can cause respiratory illness, so students and staff should be up-to-date on routine vaccinations.

Maine CDC recommends prevention measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. These measures include proper handwashing with soap and warm water, which is especially important after using the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. When soap and water is not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands and avoid close contact with people who are sick. Stay home while you are sick and avoid close contact with others. Wear a cloth face covering in public indoor spaces, especially if you are not vaccinated. Cloth face coverings are recommended in schools and childcare settings for people over 5 years of age. Get a COVID vaccine when it is available to you. When in public, avoid social distances of less than 6 feet and direct physical contact.

In accordance with privacy guidelines, no additional information regarding the individual who tested positive can be shared. We will continue to monitor the situation and will notify you if there are any changes. Questions for the school can be directed to the main office by calling 825-3364.
