- 2. Please complete the "Consent and Release Certificate" (last page of the physical form) including the insurance information. If you do not have insurance, an Insurance Waiver (available in the Athletic Office) is needed for your student to participate in conditioning, practices and/or games.
- 3. When all four (4) pages are completed, return the form to the athletic office.
 - Athletes MUST have a completed physical form on file in the Athletic Office <u>before</u> they can participate in tryouts and/or conditioning. Physicals MUST be completed AFTER April 1, 2023, to be valid for the summer (beginning June 1, 2023) and the entire 2023-24 school year. It may be difficult to obtain an appointment with a family doctor. Contact your doctor as soon as possible to avoid problems in starting your athletic career at Highland High School.
