Get organized!



Create a "college central" space for mail

Create a calendar (Google, dry erase) for deadlines

Keep a notebook or electronic file with your contacts with each school

Super linear? You might want a spreadsheet.

Schedule "COLLEGE TIME" weekly

Rules for "College Time"

- 1. No phones or other devices unless you are actively researching schools or scheduling visits.
- 2. Length of meeting will vary depending on the time of year.
- 3. Set actionable goals/tasks for the week.
- 4. Students can ask parents anything during the week.
- 5. Parents cannot ask (nag) during the week UNLESS the items in #3 are not completed. Then, let the haranguing commence for the next week!




- Everyone is awesome.

In a generation...

Test prep companies spring up

Test-optional is seen as the outlier

Tests were postponed or cancelled

Colleges responded by removing tests from admission consideration

"How could something "so important" just go away overnight?"

MORE THAN 1400 schools in the US are TEST OPTIONAL for Fall 2023 admission

Higher Education Fair Admissions Act makes all IL public universities test-optional.

The Transcript



- •GPA
- Courses taken and grade trends.
- How did you take advantage of the curriculum you were offered?
- •Are there specific course requirements for the major?

How do you fit socially?



Be unapologetically passionate about your interests.

What are your non-negotiables?

How will this school get you where you want to go?

List of Activities

- There are no activities that count more than others
- It's not a contest to see how many things you've done; do what you love.
- Don't forget about work or family responsibilities
- •Some schools don't even LOOK at activities as part of the process.
- •It's OK to be "well lopsided."



Letters of Recommendation

- Can give further insight into the student
- Not just what you've done, but who you are.
- Usually accompanied by a school profile
- Help us to see the student in the parameters of that particular institution
- •In other words, a third party endorsement

Want to be really nice? Write a thank you note!

Essays and Personal Statements

This past year, I read about 1800 applications.

Over the course of my career, I've read more than 35,000 essays.



Ask Yourself

"What do I want the reader to know about me that will not be apparent from the rest of the application?"

The Common Application

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

These questions on Common App are ABSOLUTELY OPTIONAL.

- Can you see yourself as part of the community?
- •Is this a PERFECT place? Or a FANTASTIC MATCH for your abilities, personality and goals?

Keep In Mind

- We admit far more students than we can enroll
- It's OK to tell a school you've moved on.
- •Only apply to schools in which you are truly interested!
