

## SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

College Place High School was founded in 2014 as a four-year comprehensive high school striving to do school differently. We have set our sights high, and aim to create an environment that will not only teach kids, but inspire them to be lifelong learners. We value extending learning beyond the classroom, and incorporate learning opportunities out into the community. We are located in the Walla Walla Valley, a rural agricultural area of southeastern Washington.

### CURRICULUM

Our curriculum is represented by a wide range of courses that fit our mission and vision to be an entrepreneurial flavored school. Our goal is to use a project-based, hands-on approach while also keeping traditional instructional models. We combine the theory and application of our curriculum to allow students the opportunity to realize holistic learning through projects.

We offer a comprehensive curriculum through ELL and special education services, career and technical courses, Honors courses, and dual-credit opportunities through College in the High School, Running Start, and skill center programs. At the freshmen and sophomore level English and history courses are integrated and team-taught. Seniors participate in "Studio 57," a year-long capstone project class that partners with local businesses. A two-week "J-Term" offers students hands-on, experiential classes fueled by teacher and student passions.

The school year is divided into two semesters. The school day is divided into three two-hour blocks Monday through Thursday with all six periods meeting on Friday.

# **Advanced Coursework and College Credit Options:**

9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> English, World History, U.S. History, College in the High School American Government, Psychology, Personal Finance, English 11, and English 12. We offer several CTE college credit options for students as well.

#### CREDITS AND GRADUATION

A minimum of 24 credits are needed for the class of 2022 students to receive a diploma from College Place High School. One half credit is awarded for each semester course completed with a grade of 60% or higher. The minimum credit distribution for graduation is as follows:
