What is a CASA Volunteer?

A CASA volunteer is also known as a Court Appointed Special Advocate or CASA. They are volunteers from all walks of life who are trained by our organization to advocate for the best interests of foster children. They are not a foster parent, they are a voice making a real difference at a critical turning point in the child's life. It is the only program of its kind with volunteers empowered directly by the courts to provide children with one-on-one advocacy.

Volunteer Requirements

- Must be age 21 or over
- Pass background checks
- Complete 30 hour training
- Spend an average of 6 hours on some months working a case
- Make at least 1 visit with each child per month
