Superintendent Report

Good News Report

Superintendent Report

Supt. Bailey has been exploring options for making the high school gym floor safer and the entire gym more user friendly. The districts' portable ramp cannot support the automatic scrubbers to get down the steps. Also, there is not a floor drain in the gym to drain the water after cleaning. To solve this problem, the district will purchase a 17-inch automatic floor scrubber with a detachable tank to keep the gym floor clean. The machine will be kept in one of the storage rooms right off of the gym. Total cost for the scrubber, battery and pads is \$4,752.42.

South Dakota school districts received a memo from the SDDOE regarding supply chain disruptions in the School Nutrition Programs. To avoid disruptions, they are recommending the following: continual communication with stakeholders, emergency purchases, finding different vendors, purchasing supplies locally, and using creative and flexible menus. Fortunately, the district has not experienced any supply shortages yet, but it is likely to happen. The district may be forced to offer only one entrée option during lunch. The lunch program will continue with the current practice, however Supt. Bailey wanted the board and district stakeholders to be aware of the potential challenges.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee met with Gavin Benson from Site Logic on Friday at 4:30 p.m. G. Benson wanted to address the questions that arose during the last special board meeting. Most of the meeting focused on ventilation unit options, building addition possibilities, and power factor rates.

The district received the Quidel QuickVue over-the-counter COVID-19 testing materials recently. The allotment received is two (90 test kits) cases based on the SY2021 fall enrollment of 503 students and a total estimated population of 589.013.

Supt. Bailey contacted Shauna Meyerink regarding the chip and seal project. It is unknown at this time when this will occur.

Business Manager Report

Schoenfish & Co, Inc. arrived Monday to conduct an audit of the 2020-2021 records. They will be ready for an exit review at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday.

Minor changes have been made to the budget since the preliminary was presented in May and the hearing in July. Most changes are due to grant funding.

Invoices for this month include several that reference "Perkins" and a surrounding school district. These are bills that are processed through the district for the Perkins Paragon Consortium for which Holter is the fiscal agent. The total of these invoices will be reimbursed to the district through the Perkins Grant.

K. Holter will be attending the SD Association of School Business Officials Fall Conference on September 21-23 in Chamberlain. Medical Marjuana, ESSER Records, Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing, FMLA, and Updates from DOE comprise most of the agenda.

K. Holter has contacted Jerry Spethman from D.A. Davidson & Co. regarding funding options for any potential projects. She also requested information on what impact a current project would have on the district's ability to fund any future projects. Mr. Spethman will be putting this information together and would be willing to present this information to the board at the next special board meeting, if the board so desires.

Elementary Principal Report

On Friday, September 10 an assembly was held at the flag poles in front of the elementary school in honor of the 20th anniversary of September 11 or Patriot's Day. The program was student led and consisted of high school drummers playing a cadence, the flag pledge, September 11 facts read by 5th graders, song selections by the 4th and 5th graders, and concluding with TAPS and a moment of silence.

Thursday, September 16 will be the CORE Developmental Screening for children ages Birth to 5. The screening will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church and is a joint effort between the Platte-Geddes School District and CORE Cooperative. Please call Carol Oberbroekling at the elementary school to schedule an appointment for your child.

Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on Thursday, September 30, 2021 from 1-8 p.m. Classroom teachers will schedule in-person conferences with elementary parents this year.

Secondary Principal Report

Homecoming Week is the week of Sept. 12th. This year's Theme is "Hollywood Magic" with coronation taking place on Tuesday night the 14th at 7:30 p.m. The Parade will begin at 10:30 a.m. on Friday, Sept. 17th. The school will also host the 9th Annual Missouri Valley Marching Festival featuring the band from Northern State University. The field show exhibition will take place at the football complex following the parade.

This semester there are 14 students taking Dual Credit Courses, 63 students taking Dial Virtual School Online Courses, 10 students taking Concurrent Courses and 6 students taking E-Learning classes.

American Rescue Plan

The American Rescue Plan has been returned for corrections. The Department of Education is looking for more specific responses to a few of the questions. Superintendent Bailey had a conference call with the reviewer last Friday. Needed revisions will be made and the plan will be presented for approval at the October Board Meeting.
