







Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

School Goals

The Oregon Report Card issued by the state provides data to illustrate how La Grande Middle School compares with other middle schools in the state. For LMS, 6th Grade scores were above state average in math and English language arts (ELA). 7th grade and 8th grade were slightly below state average in those subjects. With multiple languages spoken in our school, we continue to adapt to meet the needs of our diverse student population. Our school goals this year are to meet or exceed state average in ELA and math at all levels as well as increase attendance rates.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% ontime, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.






