# Course Changes to the Handbook for 2016-2017 April 26, 2016

\*GPA points given to courses at Burton High School. The current list of Category II Courses on a 5.0 GPA scale includes Calculus, Pre-Calculus, Spanish III, Academic Dual Credit, and Honors courses. Physics has been removed as the majority of our students are already taking that class. Anatomy and Physiology has also been removed as that class is not designed as a more rigorous course than Advanced Animal Science which is on a 4.0 GPA scale.

\*Academic Dual Credit Courses for Burton students include: English 1301, 1302; American Literature; World and British Literature (only if the student took Eng 1301 and 1302 as a junior); United States History 1301, 1302; United States Government; Economics; Sociology; Psychology; and Speech. Juniors and Seniors with a 3.0 average or better are allowed to take these academic dual credit courses.

\*HB5 does not require one credit of technology; however, BIM I will remain as a required course for Burton students. It is beneficial to our students and teacher skills such as Microsoft Word, Power Point, and Excel.
