ORDINANCE NO 2, 1976

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING HIGHER SALARIES FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE TOWN COUNCIL AND THE MAYOR AND SETTING THE SAME AT \$50.00 PER MONTH AND \$ \$25.00 PER MONTH, RESPECTIVELY; AND FURTHER PROVIDING THAT THE ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION AUTHORIZED HEREIN SHALL NOT BE ENJOYED BY ANY MEMBER OF THE TOWN COUNCIL (OR MAY) SITTING AT THE TIME OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORIDNANCE:

WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the members of the Town Council that the remuneration presently payable to them is inadequate, and should be increased so as to enable a broader scope of participation demanded by the position.

WHEREAS, 6.R.S. 1973, 31-4-405 requires authorization of councilmanic pay increases only by ordinance and further provided that the compensation of any member duringthis term of office shall not be increased or decreased,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FLEMING, COLORADO: section 1

That any ordinance or parts of ordinances, be and hereby are repealed in their entirety.

Section 2. That from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the members of Town Council (excluding the Mayor) shall receive \$25.00 per month

Section 3.

That from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the Mayor of the Town of Fleming shall receive as compensation the sum of \$50.00 per month.

Section 4.

The compensation increase herein ordained shall not be enjoyed by any member of the Town Council or Mayor holding office at the effective date of this ordinance, but nothing herein shall prevent its application to any such person in the event he or she shall be re-elected to a subsequent term of office at the General Municipal Election to be held April 6th 1976 , or therafter.

Section 5.

If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions or applications of this oriinance are declared to be severable.
