

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2023 Graduation Requirements~21 Credits~


- *Language Arts* – 4 credits -- English 9, English 10, English 11, and English 12
- *Science* – 3 credits -- Biology, Chemistry, and Physics OR Biology, Physical Science, and 3rd Science (Science elective or CTE)
- *Math* – 4 credits – Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Math Senior Year
- *Social Studies* – 3 credits -- World History, US History, Government/Economics
- *World Language* – 2 credits
- *VPAA* – 1 credit
- *Health* – .5 credit
- *PE* – .5 credit

Remaining Credits are Electives



Valedictorian & Salutatorian Honors

- 1 Valedictorian and 1 Salutatorian per graduating class
- Latin Honor System
- In the event that there are ties based on GPA, the state approved college entrance assessment (SAT) score will be the tie breaker
- Graduation Speakers, TVC All Academic, and TV-5 Best and the Brightest use GPA and SAT

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Criteria for dual enrollment







BULLOCK CREEK EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Program that allows you to earn both high school and college credit (different from dual enrollment opportunity)
- All college classes must be taken through Delta
- Defer your diploma for one year and take a 5th year of high school (all 5th year classes at Delta College)
- Opportunity to earn up to 60 college credits at the end of your 5th year
- More information will be covered at Parent and Student Meeting – February 3 at 6:00pm
Applications due February 19

Dual Enrollment

- Opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school
 - Classes offered at Delta, SVSU, CMU, Northwood, Davenport, and Mid-Michigan
 - Tuition and fees covered up to \$675 per class (2020-2021 amount); transportation is student's responsibility. Failing a class, must reimburse BC for tuition and fees.
 - Eligibility based on SAT, ACT, PSAT scores, GPA and attendance to determine College Readiness
- Dual enrolled classes earn a letter grade on transcript and are factored into GPA, unless otherwise declared in writing prior to the class

Work-Based Learning

- Senior Year Only
- Students must have earned a minimum of 17 credits with at least a 2.0 gpa (some businesses require 2.7 gpa)
- Students are required to take a related classes to their WBL position

Informational Meeting in January of Junior Year

SCHEDULING PROCESS

- **Choose 6 credits – can be a combination of 1-2 term classes**
- **Write down at least 3 alternate classes**
- **Complete your Request Sheet and have it signed by a parent or guardian**
