School Annual Education Report Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2015-2016 educational progress for Bullock Creek High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by Federal and State laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Bullock Creek High School continues to put increasing student achievement as a top priority. The school has made math, reading, and writing a priority for the 2015-16 school year. In addition, Bullock Creek High School uses its at-risk resources to further provide additional help to those learners who might be struggling in our core academic areas. We offer an after school intervention program, credit recover courses, a math seminar course, and a summer school program to help reach our struggling students. We are in our second year with our Bullock Creek Early College Program. The first two cohorts of students included 9 juniors each year. These students will work toward earning up to 60 college credits while earning their high school diploma over a course of 5 years.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

All District pupils in grades 9-12 are assigned to Bullock Creek High School since there is only one high school building in this district that serves this grade span of students. Students may also be assigned to this building for a program that better meets their education needs.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

A copy of the school improvement plan for Bullock Creek High School is available in the high school office. The School Improvement Team was composed of several focus groups and meets during the school year to develop the school improvement plan. The goal of the team is to develop, review, and evaluate goals, objectives, and strategies for the School Improvement Plan. The School Improvement Team facilitates the continuous collection and analysis of academic assessment data to quide instruction and evaluate progress toward student achievement goals.

ABOUT BULLOCK CREEK HIGH SCHOOL

Bullock Creek High School enrollment in 2015-2016 was 571 students. There were 35 professional staff members and 10 support staff members during the 2015-2016 school year that serviced the students. There were two administrators, a high school principal and a high school assistant principal. In addition to the teaching staff, BCHS also had 1 1/2 counselors.

All professional staff members are fully certified to teach the subjects that they are assigned. 100% of the Bullock Creek High School Staff are considered High Qualified as defined under No Child Left Behind.

In addition to our core curriculum, BCHS offered a variety of opportunities its students. BCHS offered a CTE program in Construction Trades and offered the following programs off campus: chemical processing and Great Lakes Bay Early College. Students also participate in Midland County CTE programs. Students have the opportunity to take dual enrollment classes and this year sophomores had the chance to apply for the Bullock Creek Early College. Students in Bullock Creek competed in the MITES competition. Bullock Creek High School also has a very strong Robotics program.

A copy of the Core Curriculum is available in the high school office. Bullock Creek offers a curriculum aligned with the Michigan Merit Curriculum with emphasis on Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. In addition, we offer an array of business, industrial arts, foreign language, and fine arts classes.

Each staff member is provided with the curriculum that is appropriate to the classes they teach. Pacing guides, curriculum checklists, and common assessments have been developed for all four core content areas.

Bullock Creek High School also uses Skyward Family Access, which is a system that parents can use to check their student's grades at anytime during the school year. This is a very popular way for parents to keep up to date on their student's progress during the school year.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT)

In the 2015-16 school year, Bullock Creek High School had 48 students (including early college students) enrolled in postsecondary classes and a total of 400 college credits were earned.

In the 2014-2015 school year, Bullock Creek High School had 32 students enrolled in postsecondary classes and a total of 100 college credits were earned. In the 2013-2014 school year, Bullock Creek High School had 30 students enrolled in postsecondary classes and a total of 146 college credits were earned. During the 2012-2013 school year, Bullock Creek High School had 27 students enrolled in postsecondary classes and a total of 313 college credits were earned. During the 2011-12 school year, 22 students were enrolled in post secondary classes and a total 174 credits were granted. In 2010-11, 23 students were enrolled in post secondary classes and 65 total credits were granted.

Bullock Creek High School started its own Early College Program during the 2014-15 school year. The first cohort of Juniors included 9 students in 2014-15. The second cohort of Juniors included 9 students in 2015-16. Bullock Creek High School also had 1 student attending the Great Lakes Bay Early College Program offered at Saginaw Valley State University. Students in these programs were able to earn both high school and college credit.

THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED (AP/IB)

There are not AP classes offered at Bullock Creek High School but students in the following courses took the AP test to try and earn college credit:

Biology II Calculus English 12 Chemistry Psychology Spanish 3/4

During the 2015-16 school year, 13 students took an AP exam. Eight students took the AP test for Biology, 5 students took the AP test for Calculus, 1 student took the AP test for Psychology, 1 students took the AP test for Chemistry, 1 student took the AP test for Spanish, and 1 student took the AP test of English Literature and Composition. A total of 4 students earned scores leading to college credit.

PRINCIPAL'S REMARKS

The 2015-2016 school year was another successful year and brought many accomplishments to the students and staff at Bullock Creek High School. Bullock Creek High School students continue to score well on the state and national assessments. The staff, students, and parents at Bullock Creek High School are to be commended for their efforts to make Bullock Creek High School such a wonderful place to attend.
