# Goal 1: Students in grade 2 will demonstrate reading proficiency

#### Measurable Objective 1:

80% of Second grade students will Demonstrate a proficiency in reading as measured by DIBELS assessment in English Language Arts by 06/06/2014 as measured by the DIBELS assessment given three times per year.

#### Strategy 1:

Diagnostic Reading Lab - Students (grades K-1) will interact for an additional 30 minutes per day in reading and writing instruction through the Diagnostic Reading Lab. There, teachers will specifically target skills necessary to bring readers through the developmental continuum of reading.

# Goal 2: All Students will demonstrate improved ability to read, comprehend and write in all content areas (College and Career Ready).

# **Measurable Objective 1:**

A 5% increase of All Students will Demonstrate a proficiency in close and critical reading of both narrative and informational texts in all content areas. Economically Disadvantaged and Students with Disabilities will increase their proficiency by 5% in English Language Arts by 06/09/2014 as measured by Riverside Tests on DD, MEAP, Explore, Plan, ACT and local assessments.

# Strategy 1:

At Risk Math Teacher - A total of 2.0 FTE teachers will be hired by the district to focus entirely on increasing student proficiency in the area of mathematics. While the individual design of each program at the building level will be deteremined by the school improvement plan of the building, the overall goal of this strategy will be to bring our student proficiency rates up to state average.

#### Strategy 1:

Writing Workshop - All K-5 teachers will continue to implement the MAISA Writing Units and will be supported by a writing coach who will observe, model, coach and support the implementation of writing in both ELA, science and social studies.

6-8 teachers will continue to implement the MAISA Writing Units and will be support by the Great Lakes Bay Consortium

9-12 teachers have not been included in this work up to this point.

Co-Teaching of Mathematics at High School - Teachers at Bullock Creek High School will be trained in co-teaching to make sure that instruction for special education students is effective and meets the individual needs of each student.
