The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has not been given one of these labels for the current school year.

This past school year has been an exciting one for Floyd Elementary School. We have seen the addition of the Community School Model, the addition of a Nature Kindergarten program, and many exciting curriculum changes. Life in the school never gets boring.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. For the past several years, students at Floyd Elementary are assigned based on geographic boundaries.
2. We are in the second year of our current school improvement plan.
3. Our school boasts a quality school program with one highlight being our Nature Kindergarten program.
