STUDENT AUTOMOBILE USE (REGULATIONS)

In accordance with the policy of the board of education, the following rules and regulations shall govern student parking at the public schools:

- 1. Students who wish to park a motor vehicle in any school parking area must register the vehicle with the school and must possess an appropriate and valid Oklahoma operator's permit or license.
- Vehicles (including cycles) are to be parked in the designated area north of the high school on a first come, first served basis. On an as needed basis, overflow parking will be permitted south of the auditorium. Students will not park vehicles in the agriculture building parking lot, on streets, or in undesignated parking areas. Students who improperly park their vehicles or park their vehicles in such a manner as to interfere with movement into or out of the parking lot will be issued a warning. A second violation will result in the loss of parking privileges for the remainder of the school year.
- 3. Once parked, student vehicles may not be driven until school is dismissed for the day unless the student is excused to leave school for the day. Extenuating circumstances will be evaluated individually by the administration. Vehicles may not be driven during the lunch period. Riding in vehicles other than with a parent/guardian at lunch is not permitted. Students who park their vehicles off campus are not excluded from this rule.
- 4. Bus transportation will be provided to transport students to and from the cafeteria. Students may not drive during the lunch period without administrative approval.
- 5. Vehicles shall not be driven on any grass area or upon or into any area not designated as a drive way or parking area. Motorcycles and bicycles must be parked in the area provided and may not be ridden around the campus.
- 6. All state laws, city laws, ordinances, and school rules and regulations shall be strictly enforced. Accident investigations will be conducted by the Yale Police Department.
- 7. Students who drive their vehicles to school are responsible for them and assume responsibility in the event of an accident, theft, etc. The administration recommends that students lock their vehicles when parked.
- 8. Any student in violation of any of these rules shall, on the first offense, be suspended from operating a vehicle on school premises for two (2) weeks. A second violation shall result in the permanent suspension of driving privileges.
