A Note From Mrs. Pelletier:



they also have online KHAN Academy and DreamBox lessons due EVERY Friday!





From Ms. Jewett's room:

We have begun the school year with our Survival theme!

Our reading and writing focus is on narrative stories this trimester. All students have chosen a book to read in our ELA class that is based on the following: a book they have not read before, a book that has a survival theme, and is the "just right fit" (not too easy, not too hard). Students will be asked to read for 120 minutes per week (some of that will be in class time) and to log their time.



We have been looking at character development by watching a short film called "Hair Love" in our Survival Stories class. Students

are asked to look at facial expressions and body language of the characters in the videos in order to determine what we know about them. We will be developing characters in

order to begin writing our own short narrative stories.



Google Classroom (Gold~ ELA and Black~ Survival Stories) are updated each class day with the outline of the day and posted assignments. We have recently begun an in-class review of the 8 parts of speech, coming up with some creative nouns, adjectives, interjections, and adverbs, to name a few!

It's been really wonderful to be back in the classroom with our Katahdin students!!!

The News from Mr. A's Classes!

- Things seem to be off to a very fast start in my classes this fall and the kids seem to be settling in quickly. It's nice to have things a little more normal this year, and my students appear to be happy to be back to school!
- In my "Wilderness Survival" class, students seem to be enjoying all of our outdoor activities! We've been in the woods discussing everything from what can be challenging and difficult in a wilderness setting, to putting together "survival kits", and for many different





types of trips. It's always interesting to see how much kids already know about the outdoors! Soon we will be building debris huts & shelters out of natural materials.

- In my "Economics" class, students are getting familiar with what economics is and how it affects all of us, and how we all participate in the economy, everyday. We've been discussing the history of money, goods and services, the four factors of production (natural resources, labor, capital, and entrepreneurship), and the difference between micro and

macro economics. Soon we will be learning about supply & demand and the stock market!
