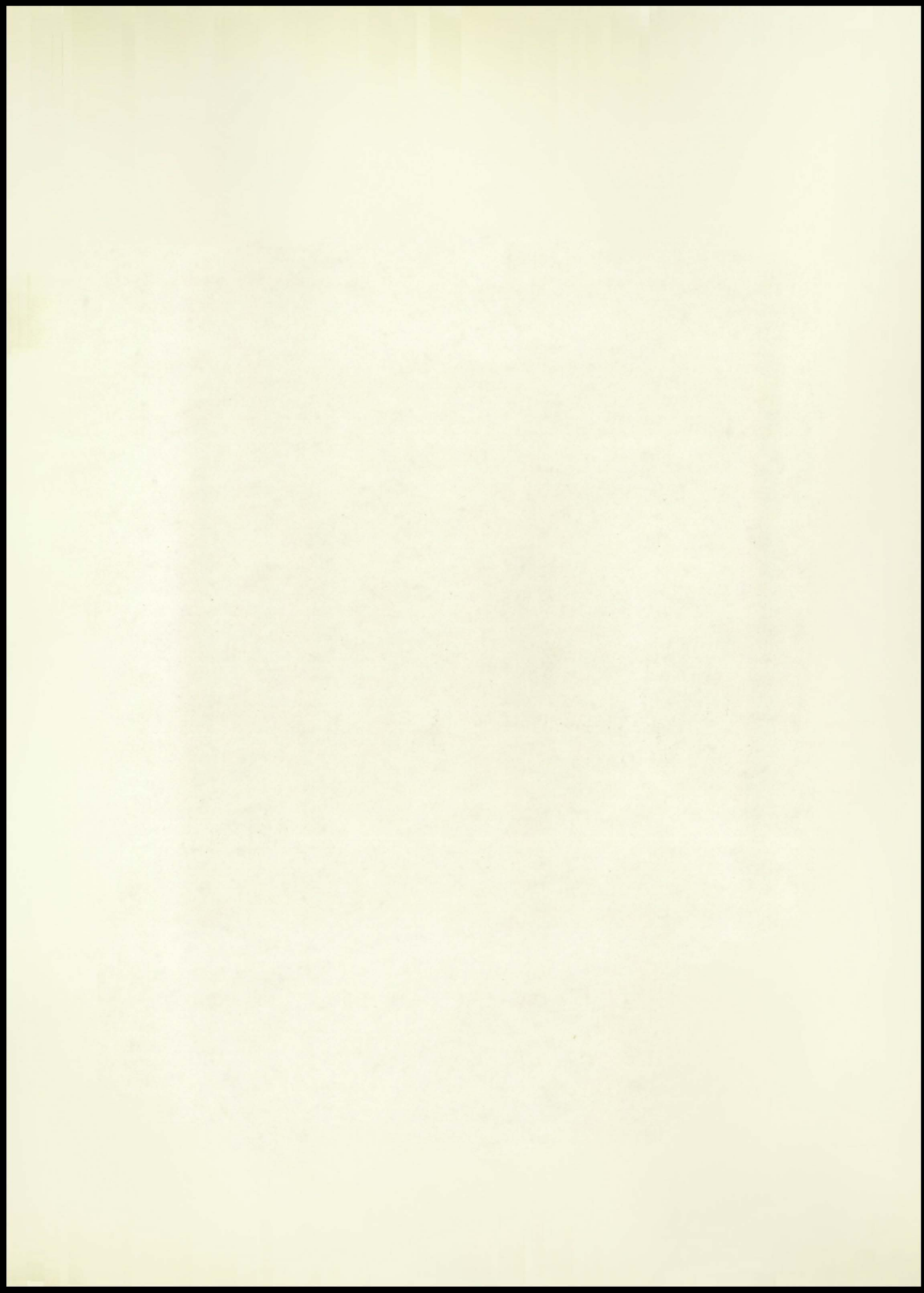


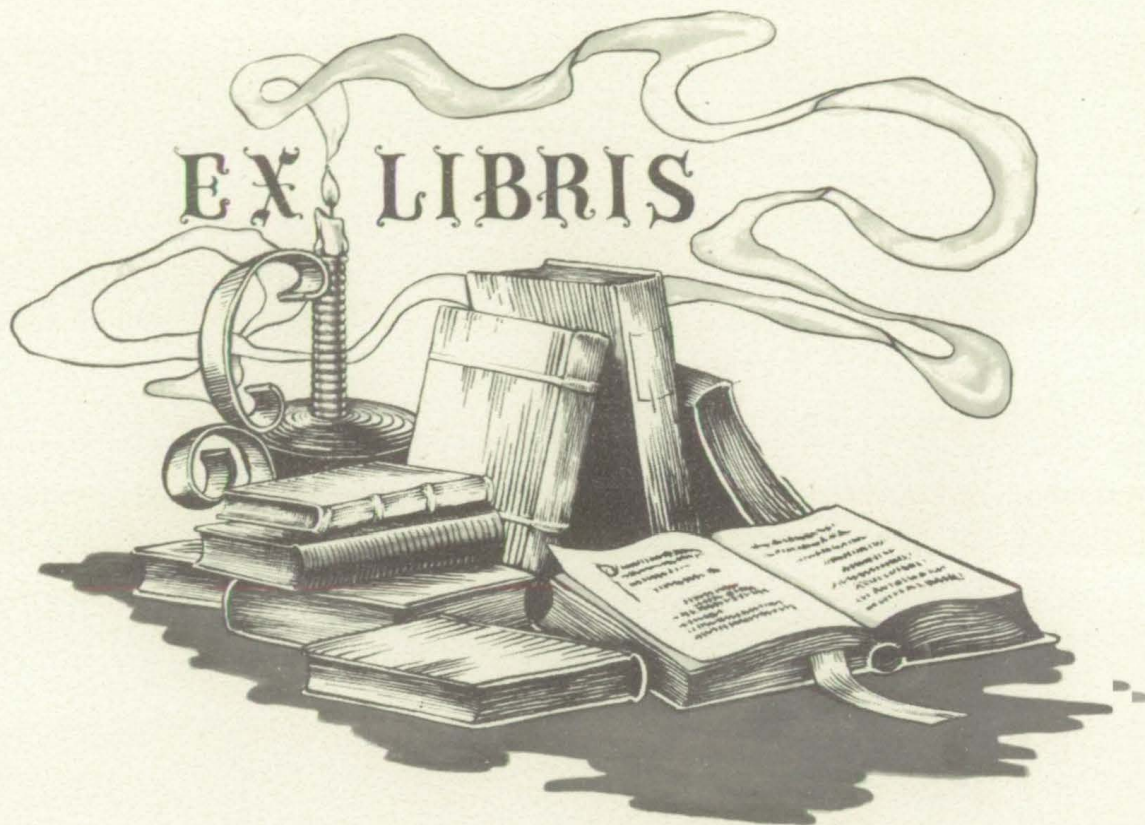

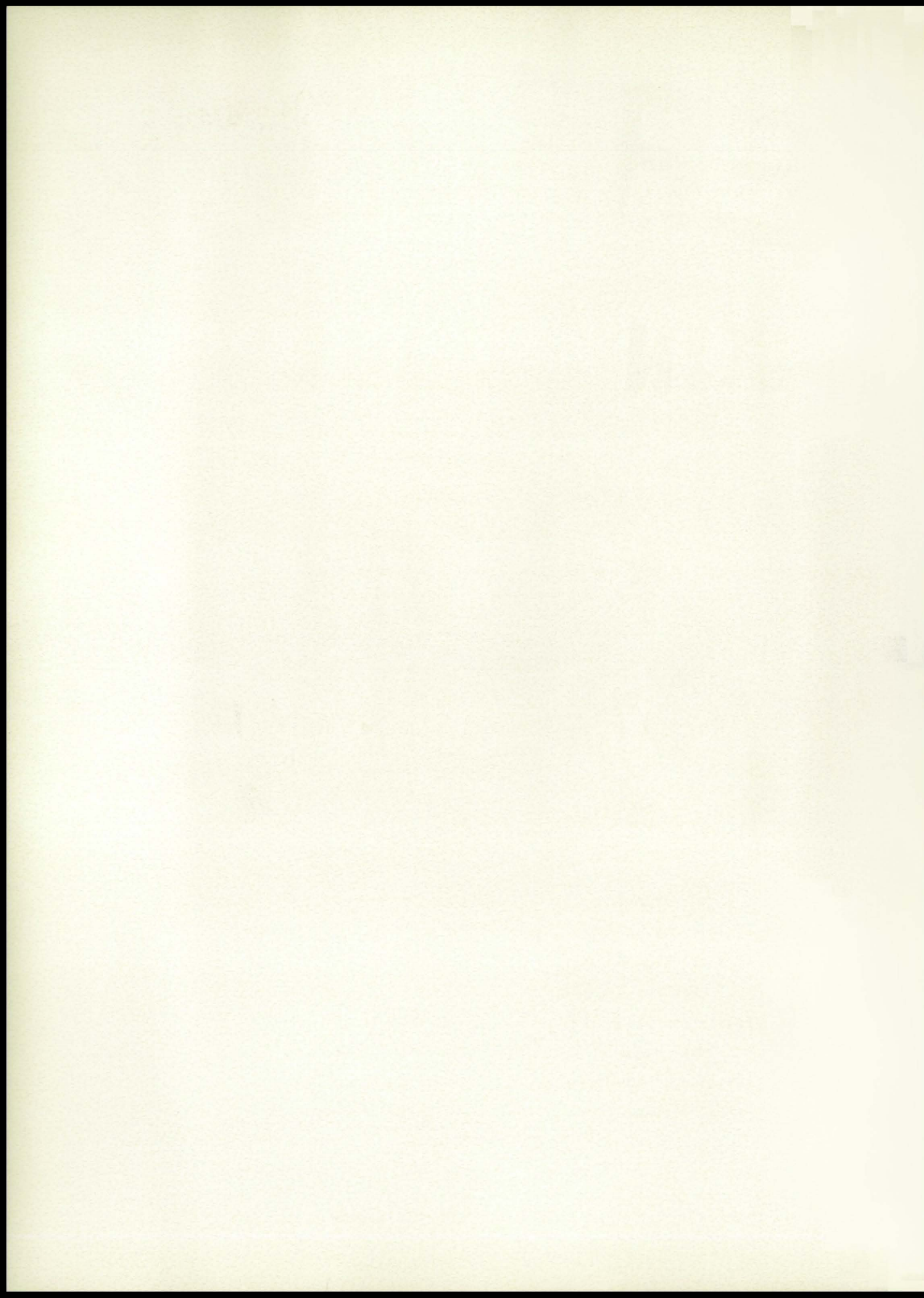

From the Senior Class of 1953, these two people were chosen for their activities and appearances.

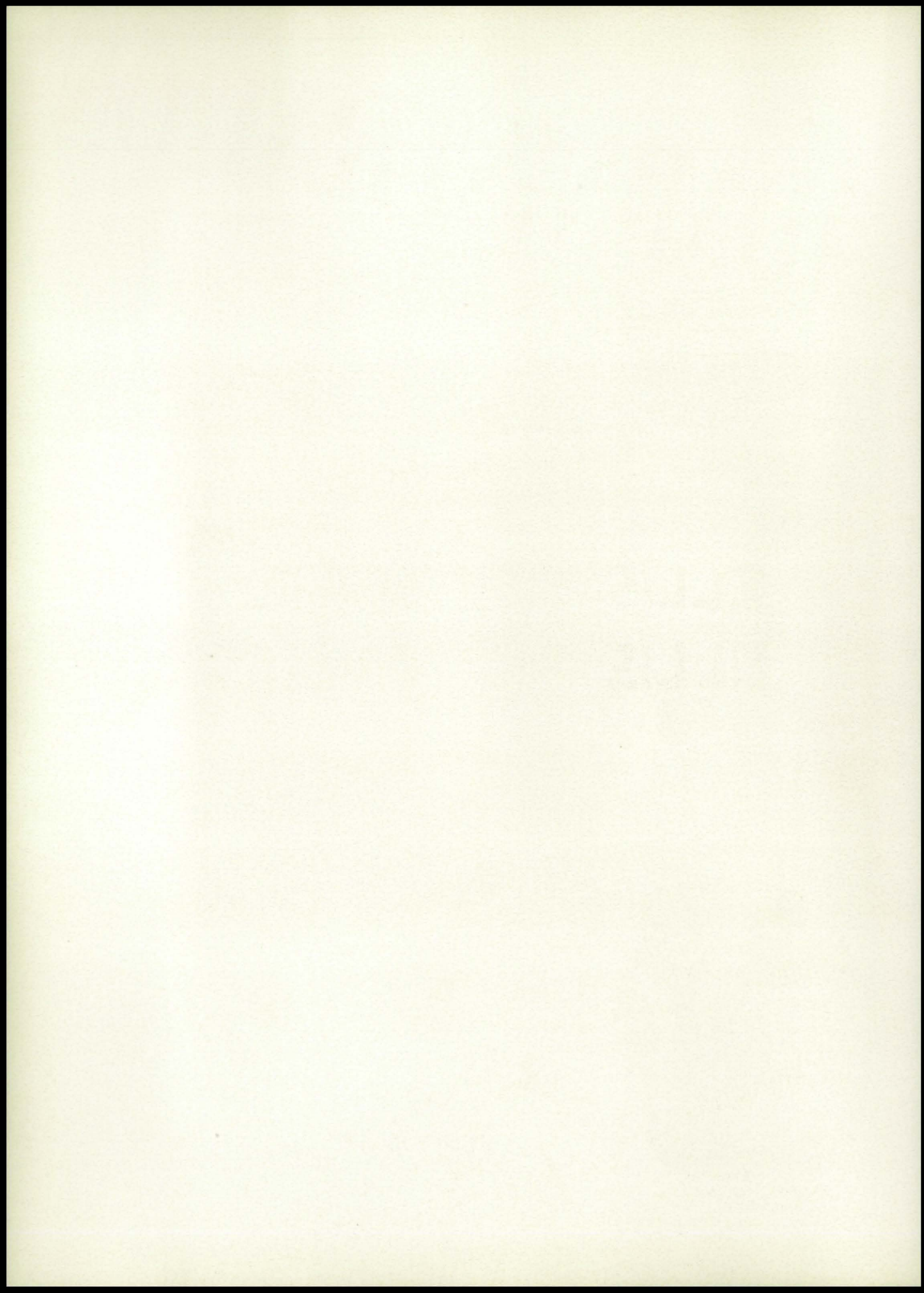

During the year we lost Eddie Thomas, Lawrence Zerfas, Delbert Dietrich, and Delores Fowler.

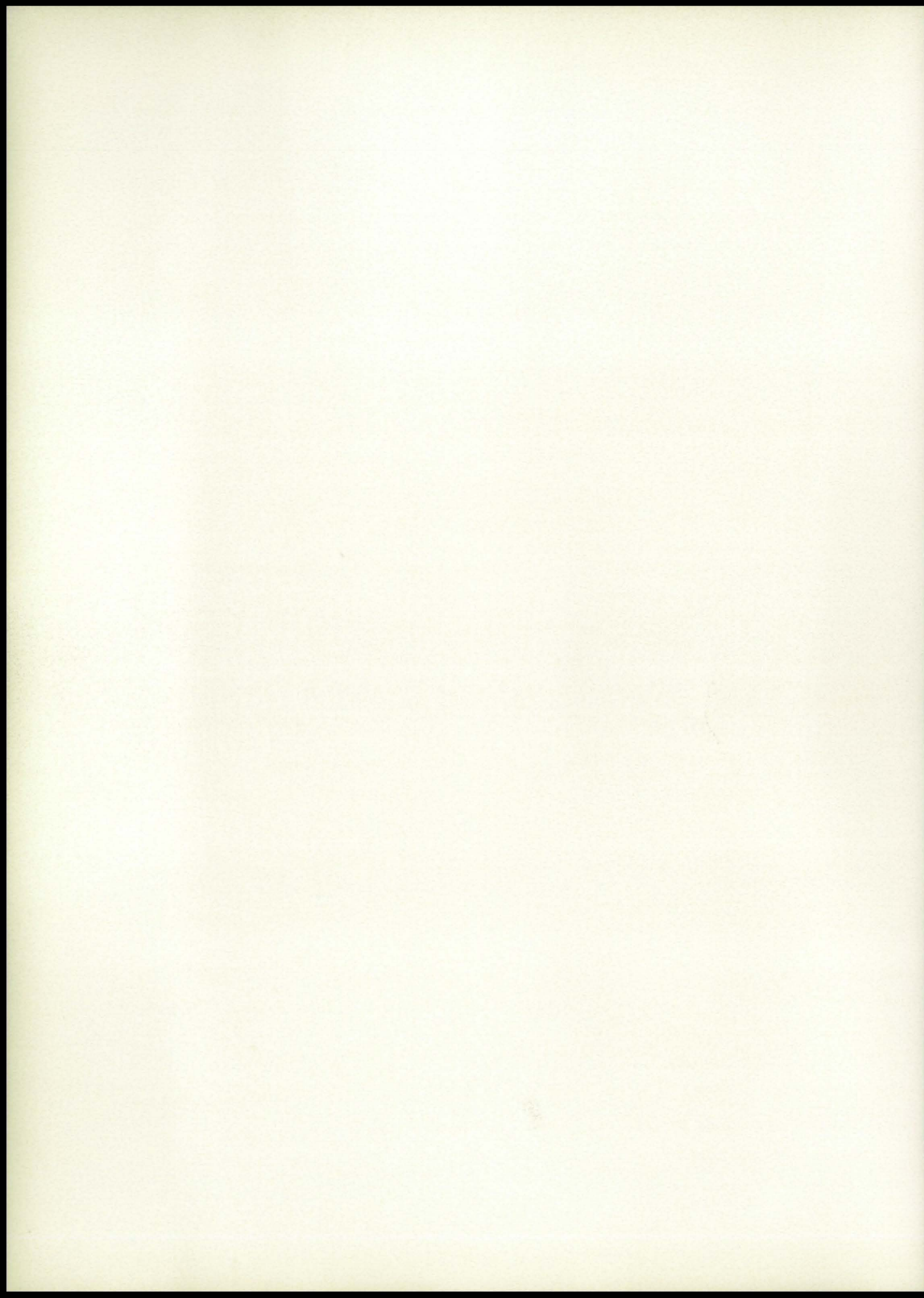
In the summer vacation of 1952 we lost Donald Kahn, Doris Kahn, James Augustine, and Ruth Ann Suiter.
