Miss Blaine Armbruster and Don Rowland were given the honor of being chosen King and Queen of the 1953 yearbook of Ellis High School.


From the Senior Class of 1953, these two people were chosen for their activities and appearances.

Our representatives to the Student Congress in our junior year were Donald Schoech, Darrell Gabel, and Janet Nicholson.


During the year we lost Eddie Thomas, Lawrence Zerfas, Delbert Dietrich, and Delores Fowler.
