




Mid Scenes We Love So Well





Commerce Prepares Students for Career in Business









Speech and Debate Highly Successful

The speech and debate classes have been very busy this past year. Instructor, Mrs. Schoen, teaches Speech I and II. Outside activities for Speech I and II are entries in speech contests, invitational, league, district and state. This year contestants entered Oberlin and Larned invitational tournaments. Of eleven entries at the tournament at Oberlin, six students made the final round. At Larned Ellis secured ten I's four II's and one III. EHS entrants won the league contest at Wakeeney. Gordon Merritt was nominated for best actor and the oneact play was nominated for the best play. The contestants came home with fourteen I's and one II. Ellis sent twelve students to state speech contest. They captured seven I's and five II's.
























Kay Club


The club also was able to send representatives to the state FFA convention at Manhattan






The Railers placed Tom Weber and Darrell Smith on the Alltourney league team. Darrell Smith was also chosen for the Northwest All-area team.

For their first year of wrestling, the Railers proved to be rather remarkable. As was expected, the team as a whole did not have a winning season; but they steadily improved throughout the season.


