
Big Creek winds endlessly past the Ellis High School campus, much the same as time moves on.

May the underclassmen set higher goals and do their best to make the years ahead greater. Most of all let us strive for the freedom and peace of the future.






Ellis 28 Lacrosse 6

Charlene Honas played second position on the team throughout the year. Her overall record was 7-2 including tournament play.









