


The 1972 Ellis Cross Country team








B-TEAM








Freshmen Look Promising


E.H.S. Turns Out Outstanding Wrestlers







Under the watchful eye of Coach Patricia Hoke, the Ellis Railerettes took to the courts to compile a 3-8 season record.









As we approach the completion of these last few pages, a change from light to darkness settles over the entire year.


If each of you as a reader could extend yourself beyond the front and back covers of this yearbook you might experience, as I do, mixed emotions.


