The season started with the team having their first meet at home, the Ellis Triangular. The team ran well the first meet even though 6 of the 10 boys ran for the first time. Ellis placed 2nd out of the 3 teams that were there.

The second meet was the P -ville Invitational with Ellis placing 4th out of 6 teams. Paul Patten placed 8 th at $P$-ville with a time of 10:46. Next, Ellis traveled to Oakley on a cold and windy day and teamwise ran rather poorly. At the Norton Invitational the team placed 3rd out of 8 teams with Mike Weber leading in 5 th place with a time of 10:41

At the MCL meet at Ellis, the team took 3rd overall with Paul Patten coming in 4th. At regionals, the team took 6th out of 8 teams with the first 3 teams going to state. When asked what he thought about the cross country team this year, Coach Hulse commented, "We were awful young as far as experience goes but the kids started improving into the year and that's a good sign. We're looking forward to next year, for a trip to Manhatten.'
