THIS AGREEMENT dated this 17th day of December 2015, by and between the **Pittsgrove Township Public** School District (Pittsgrove) and the **Pennsville School District** (Pennsville).

WHEREAS Pittsgrove wishes to enter into an Interlocal Service Agreement, for the purposes of providing custodial services for Pennsville Schools effective January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016, as outlined in the Master Contract between Pittsgrove and GCA, and

WHEREAS both parties agree to the terms and conditions outlined in the Master Contract between Pittsgrove and GCA and wishes to join that contract for a term of six (6) months, effective January 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016.

WHEREAS Pittsgrove and Pennsville have each separately consented and resolved to enter into an Interlocal Service Agreement pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 et seq. regarding the custodial services to be provided by GCA; and

WHEREAS the contract held with GCA has been duly bid and advertised and allows for additional services to be provided to other school districts, and

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the mutual promises made herein, the two parties agree as follows:

- 1. Costs of the services: The two parties agree to the sum of \$ 565,442.06
- 2. Governing Law: This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- 3. <u>Dispute:</u> If a dispute arises in the contract, arbitration will be resolved by the respective county superintendents.
- 4. <u>Notification:</u> By May 1, 2016, the two parties agree to notify each other if either party does not intend to enter into a new agreement for the following year.
- 5. <u>Entire Agreement:</u> This agreement may only be amended in writing and by resolutions passed by each Board of Education.
