Middle School Library Report March 2019 Martha Hovanec




March is also Women's History Month. There were displays of biographies about women who made an impact on our world



We have been involved in a lot of State test preparation, including scheduling and managing a great deal of information in the Pearson Next system to make testing possible. Many hours of work goes into the admin side of getting ready for this assessment. Teachers have been paying close attention to their pacing as to cover critical skills and concepts prio to test time.

Our school met this month to work on developing a useful scope/sequence writing resource for both grades 4 and 5 that incoporates our new writing series and other writing resources. We also met to discuss, as a school, the topic of homework. We discussed the purpose of homework, what research suggests is the impact of homework at the lementary level, how much and type of homework is effective (and what to avoid), how best to differentiate homework, appropriate consequences of no homework at the elementary level, etc.

Our school-wide PBS initiative continues to evolve and promotes a wonderful school atmosphere centered upon our school's core values – Honesty, Responsibility, Kindness, and Respect.
