





There were zero student and staff accident reports submitted this month.


I have had 262 office visits this month. The visits have been primarily for respiratory infections, GI disturbances, asthma, sore throats and minor classroom/playground injuries.

Parents continue to bring in medications for their children that need to be administered during the school day. To date, there are two students receiving daily medications including one diabetic student, three students with severe food allergies or other allergic condition that require an epi-pen for emergencies and ten students with medication as needed.
