This month, Ms. Patrick's 6th grade classes came in to research natural disasters to create a Slides presentation in small groups. I showed them how to access databases, including World Book Encyclopedia, and books using the catalog. Then, because the library was in use for another research project, she borrowed a cart of books for students to use to continue their research on a specific disaster to provide background information for a historical narrative the students were writing.

Ms. Matylewicz's 7th grade classes came to the library to prepare for debates on controversial issues about crime, such as gun control, the death penalty, and whether adolescents should be tried as adults. Ms. McCullough's 8th grade class began a research project on topics relating to the Holocaust and World War II after exploring some general books that I sent to the classroom. In the library, I reviewed with all of these classes how to use the catalog to find a book and or eBook and how to search various

databases, to save the article to work offline and to cite the articles.

Ms. DiAntonio's 7th grade OCR social studies class came to explore Greek mythology and to learn more about one major god or goddess for a report to share with the class. I provided a collection of books, including graphic novels, for her students to use to take notes and taught them how to create citations. Her 6th grade OCR geography class came to research a Central American country. I introduced them to World Book online and the CIA World Fact Book website and taught them how to create a citation and a works cited slide in their presentation.

The computers were also in demand as Mr. Ferro's 8th grade students printed out the poems they wrote so that they could be displayed. In addition, some students who are in the Go Guardian "penalty box" need to use the computers for research because Internet searches are blocked.




For most of the year, the library is a hotspot during 6th grade lunch. Our newest middle school students enjoy practicing their new freedom

to cross the hall to the library during lunch.
Some come to get new books, to read, or to do homework, but others visit to relax playing a game on their ChromeBook, coloring bookmark, or building with K'nex.




In the continuing quest for a more up-to-date and appealing collection, I weeded or removed quite a few books in April. I moved the Graphic Novel Collection to a more visible and accessible location and added a bit of marketing flair.



At the end of April, I was fortunate to be able to visit Baltimore County Public Schools and their award-winning libraries. The Director of

Libraries took us to visit 10 school libraries in schools with a 1-to-1 devices and to hear 10 stories of how a librarian reimagined the library space, the furnishings, and even the organization of the books to create a Learnings Commons that better served the needs of their students. After seeing these vibrant and welcoming spaces, I look forward to implementing some changes in our library, including more flexible use of space as fewer computers are needed.

Discussion Resolution April 11, 2018

State of New Jersey State Board of Education

RESOLUTION

The List of Religious Holidays Permitting Student Absence from School

WHEREAS, according to N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14 through 16 and N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3(j), regarding student absence from school because of religious holidays, the Commissioner of Education, with the approval of the State Board of Education, is charged with the responsibility of prescribing such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of the law; and

WHEREAS, the law provides that:

- Any student absent from school because of a religious holiday may not be deprived of any award or of eligibility or opportunity to compete for any award because of such absence;
- 2. Students who miss a test or examination because of absence on a religious holiday must be given the right to take an alternate test or examination;
- 3. To be entitled to the privileges set forth above, the student must present a written excuse signed by a parent or person standing in place of a parent;
- 4. Any absence because of a religious holiday must be recorded in the school register or in any group or class attendance record as an excused absence;
- 5. Such absence must not be recorded on any transcript or application or employment form or on any similar form; and
- 6. The Commissioner, with the approval of the State Board of Education, is required to:
 - (a) prescribe such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this act; and
 - (b) prepare a list of religious holidays on which it shall be mandatory to excuse a student. The list, however, is to be a minimum list. Boards of education, at their discretion, may add other days to the list for the schools of their districts; and

WHEREAS, although the New Jersey Department of Education makes every attempt to ensure the accuracy of the dates using the lunar, Gregorian and Julian calendars; and

WHEREAS, dates within this resolution may not be fixed before the State Board adopts the annual calendar and may require additional revision; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, the State Board of Education permits the Commissioner of Education, after annual adoption by the State Board of Education, to revise the dates provided in list of religious holidays.

WHEREAS, the district board of education has the right to add any bona fide religious holiday to the list for its own schools; now therefore be it,

RESOLVED that the State Board of Education adopts the following list of religious holidays for the 2018 - 2019 school year:
