Report to the Board of Education

February 2018

February is a short month that feels long, but it is also a good time to curl up with a good book. Circulation statistics for the month confirm that. In February, 1075 books were checked out of the Middle School Library. Thirty five classes and 440 independent students came to the library this month.

In recent years, February means Blind Date with a Book month at the Middle school. Kids start asking about it in the fall, so it is now an annual tradition. Participation is voluntary, but anyone who participates needs to commit to reading at least 20 pages of the book they choose, which is gift wrapped. Students get hints to help select a good match for them: AR reading level and point value and a heart with a description or a word cloud. This year, I borrowed two eighth grade classes and asked them to recommend books that they liked to 6th and seventh graders. The eight graders chose books, created the hint hearts, and wrapped the books. They did a great job and really seemed to enjoy recommending their favorite books. While I had those classes. I also taught them how to write a brief book review to add to the online catalog to help other students choose great books using the catalog.

February is also Black History month. This year, I took a more integrated approach and infused Black History into all book displays. I created displays of books on each table which included fiction and non-fiction books with a related theme. Each group included books about African-Americans or the African-American experience. For example, one table featured several new novels set during World War II. I added non-fiction books, including one about the Tuskegee Airmen. Another table had an education theme, and included books about children who sought the right to an education, like *Three Cups of Tea*, *I am Malala*, and *The Forbidden Schoolhouse: The True and Dramatic Story of Prudence Crandall and her Students*, which is about a school established to educate African-American girls in the 1800's. On a table featuring books about space, students found both Neil deGrasse Tyson's book and a biography of Leland Melvin, a former Detroit Lion who flew on the space shuttle and helped build the International Space Station. I hoped attract more attention than a display about in isolation.

Mrs. Moulder's sixth grade classes came to the library to research natural disasters like volcanoes, tsunamis, blizzards, and hurricanes. I assisted them in using the catalog to find books that would supply facts about what causes each disaster, how to prepare for it, and how it is measured and predicted. In groups, students will create Slides presentations to accompany oral presentations. Students also chose a specific disaster, like the Great San Francisco Earthquake of 1906

In February, I worked with Mrs. Matylewicz to revise an introduction to poetry which we have done in the past. The revised activity included examining multiple stations where groups of library books were displayed. Each table had a collection of books on a similar theme or belonging to a similar category, like nature, America, classic American poets, sports and fun, concrete poems and form poems, and emotions. Students moved about the room visiting at least 6 of the 8 tables to find a poem they liked in each category. This exploration of a variety of poetry exposed them a range of poetry from Casey at the Bat and Shel Silverstein's poems to Robert Frost's nature poems and Shakespeare's sonnets. From the 6 to 8 poems that they liked, they will choose one to write about at the end of their poetry unit. We were pleased at the level of engagement and enjoyment that we saw.

During February, we had a new addition to the library: a cafe table. Because we rarely use a class set of computers since the students have Chromebooks, I consolidated the computers and have been trying to create different areas for different functions. The cafe table is great for collaboration or for students who are in the library independently when a class is here. It is also an option for students who prefer to stand while doing an assignment.

A good portion of the room has been devoted to computers, but we will eventually need only a handful of computers for students who don't have their Chromebook with them in the library, who need to print for a project or poster, or who are "in the penalty box" and are having trouble accessing programs like AR. I have been researching how other school libraries have restructured their physical space and revised their programming to remain relevant and best serve the needs of the students and staff. Book circulation is strong and likely to be strong in the middle school; in addition, the library can offer collaborative workspaces, comfortable reading and studying spaces, and a makerspace for hands-on learning. The Pennsville Middle School Library will continue to adapt to the changing needs of its clients.
