Pennsville Middle School Library Report for December 2017 and January 2018

In December, 716 books were checked out. During the month, 387 students came to the library independently before or after school, during their lunch periods or from classes. In addition, 16 classes were brought to the library by teachers.

In January, 1,186 books were circulated. 493 students visited the library independently and 30 classes were brought to the library.

According to Renaissance Place, the Middle School students read 310 books and 16,587,571 words in December and 1393 books and 76,229,531 words since school started. In January, students read 527 books and 25,514,499 words, which brings us to a total of 1998 books and 105, 570, 584 words read by our students in this school year.

Snow days, holidays, illnesses, and kids without ChromeBooks have all impacted the library in the past two months. Teachers adjusted their scheduled library visits because of the first three items. I see more independent walk-ins as the avid readers stock up on books for holidays and snow days; kids who were absent come independently to return, renew, and replace their library books; and kids without ChromeBooks (and their teachers) remember how great it is that there are desktop computers in the library. I also have had more kids who were recently absent sent to the library to take tests.

Because the kids are a little stir-crazy from the cold and a little tired of each others' company, I am also seeing regular lunch-time visitors who want to read or put together a puzzle or just escape from the noise or drama in the cafeteria. On the other hand, I am seeing fewer 6th graders coming from lunch to play games on their ChromeBooks since some of the games were blocked, which reduces the noise and the drama in the library. This makes for a more restful and a more productive environment for the kids who want to escape the hustle and bustle of the cafeteria, to read a book, or to work on homework and projects.

I have had 270 office visits this month. The visits have been primarily for respiratory infections,


GI disturbances, asthma, sore throats and minor classroom/playground injuries.
