Notice to Families and Staff,

Please find below a statement from Galesburg-Augusta Community School District and Kalamazoo County Health & Community Services Department regarding the recent COVID-19 positive tests.

Today, the Galesburg-Augusta Community School District learned of a middle school student who has tested positive for COVID-19. We have identified those who are considered close contacts and have notified those that need to quarantine.

Total COVID-19 positive cases per building, staff, students, and the district totals are available on our website under "[COVID-19 Dashboard](#)."

Galesburg-Augusta Community School District works closely with the Kalamazoo County Health & Community Services Department on all public health recommendations for the district, the specific school buildings, and those identified as affected individuals. As a reminder to parents and guardians:

PLEASE, if your child is ill, keep them home and get them tested as soon as possible.

Reported symptoms include cold-like symptoms, such as runny/stuffy nose, fever, sore throat, muscle pain, chills, new loss of taste or smell, feeling out of breath, and cough.

We need to stress how important it is, that parents ask their student(s) each day if they have any symptoms. If your child has any symptoms of COVID-19, they should be kept home, and the parent or guardian should contact their child's Primary Care Physician.

This will reduce the risk of spread in school, among athletic teams, and keep others from being quarantined.
