- Teachers follow Arkansas Curriculum Standards
- Student Assessment: Renaissance STAR, ACT Grade 11, NWEA Maps, ACT Aspire, and Civics Exam (Grade 11).
 Students in grades 10-12 will participate in the ACT Work Keys Assessment. All students will participate in progress monitoring throughout the year through the NWEA Maps and STAR Assessments. This data will help drive teacher instruction for fill learning gaps.
- Smart Core and Core Curriculum options are available for students at the three high schools. We continue
 to-offer AP course selections as well as Pre-AP courses in the middle grades and early high school. Ozarka
 College is our partner for concurrent class selections along with Certified Nursing Assistant Certifications.
 - Mountain View School District has updated the literacy curriculum materials for all grade levels. OPEN COURT is
 the program for Kindergarten to second grade. WONDERS is the program for third grade to sixth grade. Both
 programs are on the approved list of programs for the Science of Reading. My Perspectives is the program for
 seventh grade to twelfth grade. All of the programs have a digital option that also support student learning.
 - Mountain View School District Federal Programs, Gifted and Talented and Special Education Programs continue to provide services for students identified eligible for those programs.
- Mountain View School District annually updates the technology plan to continue adding and improving technology. New Chromebooks replaced out-of-date computers. MVSD is now a one-to-one in all buildings. This means that all students have access to a Chromebook.
- All returning teachers and administration have obtained the credentials needs for the Science of Reading
 Certification. New teachers to the district will begin working to obtain the necessary professional development for the certification. Teachers are now required to obtain the proficiency level in the Science of Reading for the renewal of an Arkansas teaching license.
