WHEREAS, The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights places expanded responsibilities on teachers, school administrators and boards of education to protect students from incidents of bullying, harassment and intimidation; and

WHEREAS, The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights designates the week beginning with the first Monday in October as "Week of Respect" throughout New Jersey"; and

WHEREAS, The law directs school districts to observe the "Week of Respect" through age-appropriate instruction in accordance with New Jersey's core curriculum content standards; and

WHEREAS, The Mendham Borough Board of Education recognizes the harmful impact of harassment and bullying on children and is committed to providing all of its students with a safe and secure learning environment free from intimidation; and

WHEREAS, The Mendham Borough Board of Education supports the intent of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights to protect our children, as well as the goal of previous law to enhance training and instruction to prevent harassment, intimidation and bullying. Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Mendham Borough Board of Education declares October 4 through October 8, 2021 as a "Week of Respect" in all district schools, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Week of Respect will be a part of the Mendham Borough Public Schools' ongoing efforts to foster respect among students and staff for the diverse cultures and personalities represented in our school community
