School Supplies

Many parents would like to know what supplies are required for each grade level. While there are no required supplies or donations, we always appreciate what you are able to do for your child or the classroom/school. Each school is fortunate to be able to purchase most supplies necessary for success in the classroom either automatically or when requested by teachers. From time to time teachers find that they have specific requests that fall outside of the normal materials or that are more frequently used. Please note that most supplies requested will be used to support all students in the class. Following is a list of additional supplies that teachers have suggested you might send with your child if you wish.

- 10. Start talking to your child now about school. Be happy and positive when you talk about school. Start telling your child NOW how he/she will get to school and get home from school. Talk to your child about making friends, learning new skills, and having fun. This is your child's time to shine!
- 9. What can you do right now to help your child be ready for kindergarten? Start your child's school sleep schedule as soon as possible. Experts agree that five year olds need at least 10 hours of sleep each night. What time will your child need to wake up to be ready for school? Start the early wake up and early to bed routine now so your child has time to adjust before school begins.
- 8. End of the day pick up for kindergarten students is at 2:55 p.m. before older students in the school. Teachers walk Kindergarten students to meet their families at 2:55 p.m. (Except on Wednesdays when school releases at 2:00 p.m., so kindergarten pick up is at 1:55 p.m.).
- 7. School releases at 3:00 p.m.. Kindergarten bus riders are escorted to busses at the back of the building at 2:55 p.m..
- 6. Students may eat hot lunch or bring a packed lunch from home each school day. Students can buy milk at lunch time to go with their packed lunch. ALL Coleman Schools students receive FREE breakfast and lunch each school day – no money required!
- Bring a backpack and a smile on the first day of school. No other supplies are required on the first day.
- Breakfast is served (FREE!) every school day 4. (unless there is a weather delay).
- Drop off for kindergarten is at the front of the 3. elementary school under the blue awning at 7:55 a.m. The lane closest to the curb is for drop off only. If you are walking your student to the line, please park in one of the marked spaces in the front parking lot and escort your child through the parking lot. School busses drop off at the rear of the elementary building. For safety's sake, no vehicular traffic is allowed at the rear of the building at the beginning nor the end of the school day.
- School starts Monday, August 29 at 8:00 a.m. 2. Students may be dropped off at the front of the building at 7:55 a.m. The first day of school is a full day for students.

This report is <u>critical</u> in determining the amount of money that our school receives from a variety of State and Federal supplemental programs like Title I A, At-risk (31a), Title II A, E-Rate, etc.

These supplemental programs have the potential to offer supports and services for our students including, but not limited to:

- Instructional supports (staff, supplies & materials, etc.)
- Non-instructional services (counseling, social work, health services, etc.)
- Professional Learning for staff
- Parent and Community engagement supplies and activities
- Technology

We are asking that you please complete and submit it as soon as possible, even if you believe you will not qualify or will not use the services, to ensure that additional funding for our school is available to meet the needs of our students and doesn't decrease. All information on the report submitted is confidential. Without your assistance in completing and returning the attached report, our school cannot maximize the use of available State and Federal funds. This is a great way for you to support your District without any cost and very little time expended.

Parking Lot Route and Safety

We need your help! Following these procedures in the elementary parking lot and loop is one MAJOR step toward keeping everyone safe. Thank you in advance for your cooperation:

1. For morning drop off and end of the day pick up (between 7:30-8:30 a.m. and 2:30-3:30 pm. daily) there is a one-way parking loop at the front of the elementary school:

• The ONLY entrance to the parking lot is from Washington Street (nearest intersection

Washington/Barbour).

- Cars enter off of Washington Street, park in a spot or drop off at the curb, then continue around the loop and turn onto the service drive that leads to Shaffer Road.
- The driveway off Shaffer Road is for exiting only (between 7:30-8:30 a.m. and 2:30-3:30 pm. daily). Please form two lanes – a right turn and a left turn lane – onto Shaffer Rd. as you exit the lot.

 Vehicles are not allowed to enter off of Shaffer Road at drop off/pick up time.

 Vehicles may not exit onto Washington Street at drop off/pick up time.

2. The lane closest to the curb is for pick up and drop off only, much like you see at the airport. At no time should an empty car be left in this curbside lane. If you plan to get out of your car for any reason, please park in a marked parking spot and walk up to the school.

3. Do not make a double lane along the curb. This is very dangerous for children, may cause an accident, and will block the flow of traffic. Please pull as far forward as possible before students exit your vehicle.

4. Students entering the parking lot and crossing in front of the traffic lane must be accompanied by an adult at both drop off and pick up time. Parents/ siblings who park in a marked parking space must exit their vehicle, meet the elementary child, and then accompany the student safely to the sidewalk or to the vehicle.

Thank you in advance to all family and community members for following these directions! With your care and co-operation we can keep students safe as they arrive for or leave from their day of learning. If you have questions or concerns about details relating to the parking loop, please see Mrs. Araway in the elementary office.

Schools of Choice

Under the Schools of Choice legislation (Section 105) and Section 105(c) of the School Aid Act), Kindergarten through Twelfth grade students residing within Midland County Education Service Agency (MCESA) and contiguous intermediate school districts, may apply to Coleman Community Schools for enrollment first semester of the 2022-2023 school year. Application may be made for all grades (K-12) with unlimited openings.

Transportation for these students is the responsibility of the parents or guardians.

Application must be made to the school district no later than the end of the first week of school.

Important Updates, Continued Improvement And Points Of Pride.

Health: Mrs. Weber, our School Nurse and Mrs. Clements, our Health Resource Advocate, will return this year to assist families and staff with all things health related, in conjunction with the Midland County Health Department. They provide support and training for health and wellness-related issues, monitor Health Care Plans and will provide information to students, parents and staff alike.

All protocols established for COVID positive cases will be reviewed or updated with the Health Department throughout the year and monitored daily by our Health Staff and District Administration. Positive cases will be reported through a letter or e-mail to parents in the particular classroom. Those who are positive will need to stay home for five (5) days and mask for ten (10) days. Those who are close contacts within the home will be required to mask for ten (10) days and encouraged to test if symptoms develop.

Safety: Thanks to our community, the Midland County School Resource Office Millage Renewal passed, continuing our partnership with the Midland County Sheriff's Department and Deputy Hodges. The Sheriff's Department, along with Chief Ward, Chief Cozat and the Coleman Police and Fire Department provide strong safety

protocols, training, networking and support.

Community Partnerships: Thank you to the Comet community for passing the Operating Millage Renewal during the August 2022 elections, which supports daily operations of the district such as teacher and support staff salaries, curriculum materials, additional supports and utilities among other things. This millage renewal does not impact taxes for a person's principal residence and does not increase taxes for non-homestead properties above what is currently paid with taxes.

Staffing: There is great pride in the Comet Team, the work family whose key focus is on the achievement, safety

and success of your child(ren). Our seniored staff along with the additional positions we have added or hired serve to show what dedicated professionals Coleman brings to the table. A staff directory is included on our website. Please welcome our new members to the Coleman family!

Part of the team includes two additional student interventionists in the district, further support time for students with Cognitive Impairments, additional English Language Learner (ELL) staffing, a K-12 Dean of students, a Social Emotional Learning Support/Coach part-time and an additional part-time School Social Worker.

Aligned Curriculum:

6th Grade Band: The sixth grade band students will take lunch count and attendance in the elementary, and then will get back on the bus to the jr./sr. high. They will not go to the Family Center for class. This will provide them with greater opportunities to work with those who have been in band before, use of all instruments and the jr./sr. high space and increase safety by eliminating students walking through the parking lots. Those 6th grade band students arriving after 8:20 a.m. will check in at the jr./sr. high front office before going to class; they will return to the elementary at 9:20 a.m. More information will come to students from Mr. Burkhart.

New Courses at the Jr./Sr. High: The District remains dedicated to high level instruction and a variety of options for our students. Were excited to offer new courses this fall. All of 7th grade, a class at a key transition year, will participate in three electives versus two in tri-semesters, with the third being Social Emotional Learning. Computer courses will move toward more Coding experience. In high school we have added Strength Training and Psychology/ Sociology, provided more definition to our Art 2 and Spanish 2 courses and combined Multi-Media/Social Media Marketing.

Continuing Courses and Supports: In addition to core subjects and the multitude of college level and at-risk supports already in place, our elementary and high school students will continue having access to both Spanish and American Sign Language (ASL), Level 1 and 2. All 9th grade students will be in Physical Science, ensuring they will be ready for future State required science instruction

after freshman year.

Curriculum Upgrades: Classrooms continue to receive updates in materials through TItle and General Funds. The K-12 Social Studies curriculum, both hard copies and technology-based, approved by the District Curriculum Committee (DCC) and Board will be arriving any day now, aligned with the recently updated State Standards. These materials in addition to new materials over the past four years in English (Reading & Writing), Math, Science, Music, Art and Physical Education rounded out our first full rotation of curriculum proposals. Financial Literacy, Foreign Languages and Agriscience have each also had updates. The DCC will next review and update the previous Math and Music Proposal for items not purchased in the first round.

1:1 Technology: Coleman Schools provides 1:1 technology for students in our classrooms with up-to-date AV carts, SmartBoards and Chromebooks. Upgrades have been made to our conference rooms to better support parent and virtual meetings, to our auditorium and elementary cafeteria for concerts and other events and our gyms to increase activities our students can participate in.

Students who did not ride regularly last year or who are newly enrolled should contact Transportation to ensure they are routed. Bus assignments and times will be sent out by text and/or e-mail using the districts routing software EZ Routing by August 25th, provided the student rode regularly last year or their information has been received by the department by August 19th. Others will be routed within 48 hours of receipt of information. Drivers will contact families with kindergarteners and new students prior to the start of school with pick-up, drop off times, and boarding procedures. Students will have assigned seating. When possible, loading of the bus will occur back to front, and offloading of the bus front to back to maximize student safety. Students will have hand sanitizer available when boarding the bus if they wish to use it.

Bus riders will not be allowed to ride to unassigned stops (e.g. birthday parties, sleep overs, study groups, etc.). Changes in a student's schedule from one assigned stop to another will occur in accordance with the student handbook.

Masking on the bus will follow district and CDC guidelines. As of the writing of this newsletter, masking is not required.
