## History of Title I

- Began in the mid 1960's
- Largest federal assistance program for public schools
- Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
- No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) of 2001 & Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015





#### Purpose

- To provide additional academic support to students who need it the most.
- To help students work towards meeting the standards set by the New Jersey Department of Education.





#### Schoolwide Program

As a Title I schoolwide program, Linwood uses Title I funds to improve academic achievement of all students.

All staff, resources, and classes are part of the overall Schoolwide program. Schoolwide programs can use all allocated funds to increase the amount and quality of learning time.

## Linwood's Title I Programs

In an effort to improve the academic achievement of identified Title I students, supplemental services are delivered in a number of ways, i.e., supplemental; pull-out/push-in; and/or extended day, week, or year instruction.

#### Linwood's Title I Programs

The school utilizes a variety of data to determine which students are eligible for Title I support. Entrance/exit criteria includes data based on, but not limited to:

- 2019 NJSLA ELA and math scores (if applicable No NJSLA in 2020 or 2021 due to COVID-19)
- 2020-21 district benchmark assessments (LinkIt/IRA/DRA)
- Report Cards & Teacher Recommendation





## Intervention Support

- Linwood's Strategies and Intervention class teachers will work with your child and his/her ELA/Math teacher to identify skills that require improvement.
- Students will participate in small group instruction that is differentiated to meet their academic needs.





#### **Ongoing Assistance**

Student needs will be evaluated by teachers to determine student attainment of educational objectives. Progress monitoring will include an examination of the school's local benchmark assessment scores throughout the year, report card grades, classroom performance data, as well as input from the child's ELA and/or math teacher and intervention program teacher.
