# Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Title 1 Parent and Family Engagement Requirements

**The school district and all Title 1 schools must allocate a percentage of the Title 1 budget towards instructional programs, activities, and resources for parent and family engagement.**

- Title 1 is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- The goal of Title 1 is a higher quality of education for *every* child.
- The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.



# How are schools declared Title 1 schools ?

Public schools with at least 40% of its student body who receive free and/or reduced lunch are eligible for Title 1 funds per federal law.

Free/reduced lunch percentages at Steed:

2020 – 2021: 79%

2019 – 2020: 84%

2018 – 2019: 80%

**Materials to support classroom instruction:**

Headphones, math manipulatives, academic games and learning activities for reading and math, Scholastic News, a Newline Board, Phonics and Phonological Awareness programs, a portable speaker system, toner, and intervention resources for English/Language Arts and Math

**Title 1 will also pay stipends to teachers who provide after-school tutoring in reading and math for our students, attend Leadership meetings and meetings specifically designed to support Steed's newest faculty and staff.**
