Scheduling for the 2023-2024 School Year

Students and parents will make scheduling requests for the 2023-2024 school year through the Genesis Parent Portal.

Directions:

1. Log into Genesis Parent Portal:
<https://parent.woodbridge.k12.nj.us/woodbridge/parents>
2. Select the "Scheduling" tab
3. Select the "Requests" tab
4. You will see a list of subject areas that are available for the school year.
5. Reference the guide below for grade level specific courses.
6. Each student must request eight courses.

The last day to make requests will be **January 6, 2023**.

You cannot change Genesis Parent Portal requests after they are submitted; however, your child will have an opportunity to meet with his/her guidance counselor after January 6 to make any appropriate changes. Prior to this meeting with your child, his/her counselor will review all requests to ensure that your child is meeting all mandatory graduation requirements. Please note that we cannot guarantee all requests, but we are committed to meeting as many as possible.

Current Grade 9 Students

Mandatory Courses:

1. English 2 (H, R, S)
2. Physical Education 10
3. Math (You will choose from the available options based on the previous Math course passed.)
4. Science (You will choose from the available options based on the previous Science course passed.)
5. US History 1 (AP, R, S)

***Students must select three additional courses.**

****Most students will select a second consecutive year of a World Language.**

Current Grade 10 Students

Mandatory Courses:

1. English 3 (R, S) or AP Language or SUPA Non-Fiction Writing
2. Physical Education 11
3. Math (You will choose from the available options based on the previous Math course passed.)
4. Science (You will choose from the available options based on the previous Science course passed.)
5. US History 2 (AP, R, S)
6. Careers/Financial Literacy (Unless you choose Entrepreneurship, Economics R, or Macroeconomics AP as an elective)

***Students must select two additional courses.**

Current Grade 11 Students

Mandatory Courses:

1. English 4 (R, S) or AP Literature or SUPA Practices of Academic Writing
2. Physical Education 12

***Students must select six additional courses**

****Senior Study is listed under “Elective” and can be taken in the fall and/or spring.**

Scheduling Notes

- Students who select any of the following courses should select an A/B Physical Education course: Band, Choir, JROTC, Dance, Science Research
- All students signing up for Band should select “Band R.” Following auditions, the Band teacher will place students in the appropriate course.
- All Choir Students should select “Mixed Concert Choir.” Following auditions, the choir teacher will place students in the appropriate course.
- Dance students can sign up for their preferred level, R or S. The Dance teacher will hold auditions and determine the final placement for Dance students.
- Contact your child’s guidance counselor if you do not see a preferred course in Genesis Parent Portal.
- Health: All students who sign up for Physical Education will automatically be enrolled in the appropriate Health course.
- 2.5 credit courses are paired. If you select the course in the left column, you will automatically be enrolled in the course in the right column. (See table below) The courses in the right column will not be listed in Genesis Parent Portal.

Dual Enrollment Offerings

Dual Enrollment courses offer students the opportunity to gain both Woodbridge High School credits as well as, credits to either Middlesex College, Kean University, or Syracuse University at a fraction of the cost. If you would like additional information, contact your child's guidance counselor.

Middlesex College offerings end with the letter "C". For example, Elementary Stats C, Sociology C, or Accounting C. These courses require a minimum grade of 70 to earn Middlesex College credit.

We currently offer the Tomorrows Teachers course through Kean University. This is a full year A/B course offered during Block 4 only. During the course, students will have a class at WHS, and travel to a WTSD elementary school or middle school for field experience. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher to select the course, must be able to provide their own transportation, and must apply to be enrolled in the program. If students earn a B or higher in the course they will receive credit from Kean University and may be eligible for admission at Kean University with "Advanced Standing".

We also offer courses through Syracuse University. The credits offered are for Syracuse University, but students can request a transcript to transfer these credits to other colleges or universities. These courses will have "SUPA" or "SU" in the title of the course.
