

## **Immunization Requirements for Grades K-12**

- Medical records must be certified and translated by a US doctor if needed at time of registration.
- DTaP Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade 4 doses with one given on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday or any five doses
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> grade (7 years old) and higher 3 doses
- Tdap 1 dose is required for students born after 1/1/97 entering 6th grade and higher who are 11 years of age or older
- Polio Kindergarten and 1st grade 3 doses with one given on or after the 4th birthday or any four doses
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> grade (7 years old) and higher 3 doses
- Measles 2 doses of a measles containing vaccine with the first dose given on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday. Intervals between the first and second doses cannot be less than 1 month. Laboratory evidence of immunity in lieu of the second dose is acceptable.
- Mumps-Rubella vaccines 1 dose of each given on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday required.
- Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine— 1 dose given on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday. Children, who present documented laboratory evidence, a physician's statement, or parental statement of previous Varicella disease, shall not be required to receive the Varicella vaccine.
- Hepatitis B vaccine 3 appropriately spaced doses
- Meningococcal conjugate vaccine 1 dose is required for students born after 1/1/97 entering 6th grade and higher who are 11 years
  of age or older
- Mantoux Tuberculin Test may be required depending on country of birth.
- Your child is required to have a physical examination upon entry into the school district. This exam must have been conducted no more than 365 days prior to entry.
