ESSER

What is ESSER?

The US Congress passed three stimulus bills during 2020-2021 referred to as the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency relief plan.

As part of the American Rescue Plan, the \$122 Billion Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III) is administered through the U.S. Department of Education and is intended to support efforts by states and school districts to safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools as well as address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on students.

The purpose of ESSER Funds is to award subgrants to local educational agencies (LEAs) to address the impact that COVID-19 is having on elementary and secondary schools. Of the total amount allocated to an LEA from the State's ARP ESSER III award, the LEA must reserve at least 20% of funds to address learning loss through the implementation of evidence-based interventions and ensure that those interventions respond to students' social, emotional, and academic needs and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on underrepresented student subgroups. The remaining LEA funds may be used for a wide range of activities to address needs arising from the pandemic.


The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was passed in March 2020 and included provisions for the ESSER Fund (ESSER I).




