## GUNTER ISD CHILD FIND INFORMATION

Gunter ISD offer[s] comprehensive special education services to eligible students ages three through 21 years and to children from birth through age 21 years who have a hearing or visual impairment. Children from birth to age three with other disabilities will be referred to appropriate agencies for services. All referrals are considered confidential, and services are provided at no cost. The parent, legal guardian, or surrogate parent retains the right to refuse services and are provided other procedural safeguards under federal and state law. Public school services include screening in areas of suspected disabilities, such as vision, hearing, motor skills, speech, language, and general development. Evaluations in the schools are provided for several areas of suspected disabilities, including learning disabilities, speech and language development, physical impairments, vision or hearing problems, intellectual disability, emotional disturbances, autism, health impairments, or traumatic brain injuries. A free, appropriate, public education with a full continuum of services is available. For more information concerning eligibility criteria and referral procedures, contact the principal or counselor of your local school or call the Grayson County Special Education CoOp. at 903-696-0015, 100 West Pecan, Gunter, Texas, 75058.


This year marks the 20th anniversary of $9 / 11$. Each year at Gunter ISD, our teachers make sure our students continue to learn about, and understand the events of $9 / 11$ and how they impacted our nation.

Our pep rally during the week of $9 / 11$ was not all about our school, but about our country. We honored our country and the Americans who have fought to keep our country safe. The GHS band filled the event center with the sounds of our national anthem, we recited the pledge of allegiance, the names of the 13 service men and women who recently lost their lives in Afghanistan were read as we honored them with a moment of silence, the students wore the colors of our country, and we listened to Coach Hellman recount his memories of 9-11-2001.

Teachers found unique ways to help our students understand that day in history. In some of the high school classrooms, students watched documentaries of people telling their story. Discussions about what they watched took place and students could share their thoughts with each other. Listening to another person tell the story sparks memories of other stories, and we should continue to tell them.

Middle school students in Mrs. Lemberg's class had previously written emails to family members asking them to share what they were doing, and how they reacted in the moment. The students read the emails to the class and wrote down some thoughts in a journal. The emails will be on display for all students on the campus to read. Mr. Fletchers STEAM class used technology to browse an interactive timeline using www.911memorial.com. Mrs. Harden's art students watch a video of a memorial done in SAND ART!

Our littlest tigers also spent some time talking about what a hero
 is and how people should help people. They created some really great items to put on their classroom walls that will help them remember what a great country we live in!


## Classroom Sneak Peek

The weather is getting cooler, and pumpkin season is here! Our kindergartners got a glimpse of how pumpkins grow by visiting with Farmer Tanner on Zoom! Farmer Tanner explained the life-cycle of a pumpkin from planting the seed to harvesting the crop. ## Learning Empathy

One of our very own Gunter graduates, Karissa Pelfrey, works for the City of Sherman Animal Control and she brought two current shelter animals for the students to interact with. Her colleague, Pedro, brought his shelter truck and students got to see it and pet the animals. He also spoke to all the students about what they do as animal control officers, the top five animals to stay away from if they encounter them in their neighborhood, the tools that they use to relocate animals, and how they take care of the animals in the shelter.

After the presentation, a group of fourth-grade boys helped load all of the donations for the shelter! Thank you, parents and students, for all your donations and thank you, Karissa and Pedro, for helping our students see the impact they made!

## Classroom Snea DLE Sampling a book!

5th and 7th grade students had fun getting to know the books available in the library!


The 5th grade students were treated to a multi-course "book tasting" in the library, and we can't be more exited about it! They entered the library where the tables were set with a menu, fantasy crunch, and a bottle of water. Each table held a different genre for the students to taste, and they rotated several times to be sure they had a wide variety of books to choose from.
"Chef Schroeter" walked around the tables and made expert suggestions when a student needed inspiration on which book to taste. Each student used their menu to make notes about the cover, they would then read the summary on the back or the inside cover, and finally read a few pages. Using that data, they would then determine whether they would be interested in reading that book.

Will a Penny Hold Water?


How many drops of water will a penny hold? The 5th grade scientists can tell you that it is more than you think! In Mrs. Bon's 5th grade science class, the students performed this experiment in order to master the steps of the scientific process.

After going through the proper sequence, many of the students found their hypothesis to be proven wrong, which is absolutely why the scientific process is so important. Their penny held many more drops than they thought. Some students were counting at least 30-40 drops!


How much sunlight does grass need?


Students in Mrs. Morrison's science class put their new Ford Scholar Greenhouse to use that was donated by Gunter graduate, Cassady Craddock. The students used it to put the steps of the scientific method into practice. Students planted grass seed and are testing the effects of the amount of sunlight on the grass. The greenhouse was perfect for this experiment and students will see results and draw conclusions within the next couple of weeks.
