Bergman School District Ready for Learning Plan Actions and Assurances

1. We will ensure the continuity of teaching and learning by providing a guaranteed and viable curriculum that includes virtual learning (9-12).
2. We will address unfinished learning from the prior year by using the *Arkansas Playbook: Addressing Unfinished Learning* and district developed resources.
3. We will utilize a Learning Management System.
4. We will schedule new teacher training for how to use the LMS.
5. We will collaborate with families for instruction during quarantine and AMI days.
6. We will provide support for parents and students.
7. We will provide a written communication plan for interacting with parents, students, and the community.

Action #1

We will ensure the continuity of teaching and learning by providing a guaranteed and viable curriculum that includes virtual learning (9-12).

Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum

- A guaranteed and viable curriculum will be implemented through the Bergman School District instructional model.
- The instructional model will be implemented in two settings: On-Site Instruction and virtually through Virtual Arkansas for grades 9-12.
- The diagnostic assessment to be used to identify students' strengths and weaknesses and develop individual instructional plans for addressing unfinished learning and shape decisions to be made for new learning will be Star 360 in grades K-8.
- Additionally, local formative assessments, reading screeners that align with the Science of Reading will be used to identify areas of need for remediation and enrichment in all grades and subject areas.

Virtual (Off-Site) Learning Plans

- Families may apply Virtual Learning for grades 9-12.
- Virtual Learning will be offered off-site through Virtual Arkansas.

Action #2

We will *address unfinished learning from the prior year* by using the *Arkansas Playbook: Addressing Unfinished Learning* and district developed resources.

Addressing Unfinished Learning

Procedural review and social emotional learning will be embedded continually throughout the year as we provide continued student support.

Specific items to be addressed will vary by grade span but will include at a minimum:

1. Building procedures and rules
2. PPE etiquette, social distancing, safety requirements
3. Social-emotional supports found in the Playbook.

Addressing Unfinished Learning

Unfinished Learning and Learning Deficits

The first three weeks of school (August 16 - September 3) will be used for student screening and teaching essential standards that were not taught or mastered during the previous year.

Units of instruction and resources provided in the *Playbook* will be used as a guide. Units of instruction developed by Bergman Grade Level Teams will also be used to address essential standards that were not taught or mastered during the closure. The Bergman School District instructional model will be used in the Plan-Do-Check process continuously.

- Screeners and Diagnostic assessment completed through Star 360.
- Plan-Do-Check: Data will be disaggregated in the PLC process and plans for instruction according to our instructional model will be developed and implemented.
- Star Testing K-8 will be administered three times in 2021-22.
- Teachers have access to Focus Skills provided by Star Renaissance.
- Teachers also have access to pertinent data regarding student learning and gaps.
- Teachers will utilize pertinent data to provide a variety of intervention strategies.

Arkansas Playbook: Addressing Unfinished Learning

The Playbook will be used to address unfinished learning through the following:

1. Unit plans
2. Social/Emotional strategies and support plans and resources
3. Family and Community Engagement resources
4. Documents to support our Professional Learning Community process
5. Support documents and resources for developing common formative assessments

VIRTUAL ARKANSAS & GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Meeting the needs of all students,

- Bergman High School will utilize Google Classroom, and Virtual Arkansas.
- Bergman Middle School will utilize Google Classroom.
- Bergman Elementary will utilize Google Classroom.

Action #4

We will offer training for new teachers on how to use the selected Learning Management Systems.

Learning Management Systems Training

Planned Training Opportunities:

- Online and on-demand training for teachers.
- Google Classroom training will be provided.
- OUR Co-op Sessions
- Teacher collaborations and PLC opportunities.
- Mentors will be utilized to give follow up training on the LMS to all new teachers.

Action #5

We will collaborate with families for instruction during quarantine and AMI days.

Support for Parents and Students

- Each student will be provided with the following daily for virtual learning:
 - Chromebook and charger 9-12
 - AMI packets have been sent home for grades K-2. AMI will be accessed through Google Classroom for grades 3-12.
 - AMI packets are for whole school closure, not individual quarantine.
 - K-4 teachers will contact parents to establish procedures for students to continue working during quarantine.
 - Students in 5-12 will use Google Classroom to complete assignments while in quarantine.

Action #6

We will provide support
for parents and students.

Technology Support for Parents and Students

- Each student will be provided with the following daily for virtual learning:
 - Chromebook and Charger 9-12
 - iPads will be available for students with special needs in which this is more appropriate.
 - A tech support email address has been set up for families to reach the Technology Department directly for LMS and device help.
 - Families who do not have adequate internet access to support virtual learning will be provided a hotspot by the district.
 - Surveys will be conducted to gather information on internet and device accessibility at home.

Academic Support for Families and Students

- We have hired a virtual contact for the school district- Jolene Harris.
- DESE Playbook resources are available for families that include parent support guides by grade span, COVID-19 support resources, IRI'S Center topic specific resources.
- Events and information about academic supports will be distributed through Informational Packets at each building.

Academic Support for Families and Students

Teachers will be available to families to provide academic support whether we are on or off-site. Families and students will be able to communicate with teachers through the following:

1. Email
 2. Phone call
 3. District Text Alert System-Apptegy
 4. Zoom/Google Meet conference
 5. Zoom/Meet office hours
 6. Message through learning platform
 7. Message through Remind 101 or Apptegy messenger.
 8. In person conference by appointment with health and safety guidelines in place
- Special Populations will be continually supported through implementation of their collaboratively developed individual plans. Teachers will be in consistent contact with families to ensure continuity of services. Zoom meetings will be scheduled individually with families and include a translator for non-English speaking parents to provide support as needed.

Social Emotional Support for Families and Students

- DESE Playbook resources specifically addressing social emotional support will be promoted and made available to families.
- School Counselors - Each counselor will provide social emotional support.
- Chenal will provide school based mental health counseling services.

Physical Support for Families and Students in Need

- The community of Bergman and Boone County provides a number of community resources for those in need. A running list that will be made available to parents in each buildings' informational packet and in our COVID information link on the district webpage.
- Support and resources for students experiencing homelessness will be provided through the counselors' offices at each school. Counselors will utilize homeless set aside funds and community partnerships to support student needs.
- The counselors' offices at each building in Bergman School District is poised and ready to support the emotional, physical, and psychological needs of students through the implementation of their Comprehensive Support Services Plan.

Action #7

We will provide a written communication plan for interacting with parents, students, and the community.

Communication Plan: Bergman School

- Bergman School District will communicate with parents, students, and the community regarding day-to-day expectations according to the timeline.
- Communication will occur regularly and promptly at the district and building levels.
- Announce first day of on-site instruction, explain two options of schooling (on-site and virtual), provide program overview of Digital
- Drive thru & Drive Up Open Houses were held on Bergman School Campus.
- Provide general information on first day of school: attendance, grading, general day-to-day procedure updates.
- Use social media, Remind, Apptegy, and posted Bergman Schools reopening plan on the website.

Safety & Cleaning Procedures

Safety/Cleaning: Bergman School District

- We are following the CDC and ADH guidelines for cleaning.
- Custodians are regularly disinfecting common areas during the day.
- Supplies for disinfecting and hand sanitizer will be available in every classroom.
- Water bottle filling stations will be available on each campus.
- Social distancing will be followed while students are on campus.
- Students will still go to activities/recess but will adhere to social distancing.
- Parents are asked to screen their students for Covid-19 symptoms before they come to school. Temp checks are recommended and requested.
- Buses will be sanitized after each route.
- Beginning April 1, 2021, masks are no longer required, but may be worn by any staff member or student who wishes to do so.
- School nurses will have a routine to visit their office and an isolated space for students who exhibit Covid-19 symptoms.
- Students will still eat in the cafeteria but they will social distance.
- Students in grades 9-12 will have the ability to eat outside.
