## Paws for the Principal A word From Mrs. Thompson

Yippee!! Congratulations to all students for doing a PAW-some job on the test! Teachers reported that students showed great effort on the ACT Aspire and Istation tests. Thanks to all parents/guardians for your extra encouragement at home and for making sure students were here on time each day. I look forward to sharing their results with you in the fall.

Testing is not the only thing your students have been working hard to accomplish. We're using IXL, a web-based learning and practice site, to support our curriculum this year. With thousands of skills that match what we're learning, as well as insights into student progress, IXL is a great resource to help your child excel. In IXL teachers challenge students to achieve at least an 80 SmartScore or achieve a question goal. The SmartScore is not a percentage score. It adapts to the students' responses, so even when the student gets a question wrong, it is possible to reach a 100 SmartScore. Student progress on IXL is always saved, so taking breaks is always okay. To check your student's accomplishments, click on Analytics in the top banner when your student is logged into IXL. This program will be accessible during the summer months, so we encourage parents/guardians to set goals for your students to keep skills sharp!

#### NOTES FROM NURSE STUMBAUGH

#### TDAP: Tetanus/Dipthria/Pertussis

Students are required to have a TDAP following their IIth birthday.

This requirement is for all school districts, so we encourage you to plan the appointment for the TDAP when your student has their 11th birthday to avoid long delays in scheduling at the local health department.

While planning for the TDAP, please ask about the Meningococcal Conjugate (MCV4). This immunization can be given at the same time as the TDAP and will meet your student's requirement for school until their 16th birthday.

Immunization must be current prior to the beginning of the 2022-23 school year in August. Please make your students appointment so that attendance interruptions don't occur.

#### Medications at end of school

Medications at End of School

If your student has medications at school, they must be picked-up by the last day of school, May 25th at 1:00 p.m. Medications cannot be sent home with the students, but only signed out by a parent or guardian.

All medications remaining in the Nursing Station will be disposed of on the last day school is in session through the "Take Back Program in conjunction with the local police. This includes, but is not limited to, all oral medicines, Inhaler, Epi Pens, etc..


## 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade News
