7. Superintendent's Report

Discussion, Information: A. Announcements

Board President Bellavia spoke about the great fun had during the delivery of senior lawn signs with other administrators and superintendent Mancuso. Saw many excited moms, while many senior's were still sleeping.

Community members, Lauren and Peter Charles donated gift certificates from local eateries and the grocery store and distributed to HF-L food service workers and staff who have been assisting with the food service deliveries during the school closure. Tremendous gesture. Donations of Easter candy from another generous donor will provide extra treats for families accepting meals during this time.

Middle School Principal, Shawn Williams, reported on a very successful blood drive that was hosted at the Middle School. The Red Cross Blood Donation event saw every time slot booked up. The organization received enough donations to assist 100 people.

Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, Dr. Renee Williams stood out front of the high school in the cougar outfit, waving the flag and celebrating at a distance as part of the lighting of the village on Friday evening. Many, many families participated. Assistant Manor School Principal, Joelle Weaver wore a unicorn costume at the request of students.

Director of Professional Development, Holly Sidebottom reported that teachers are doing an incredible job, with many participating in PD and making the most of the situation they are in with the school closure and working remotely.

Superintendent, Gene Mancuso spoke about these struggles that can actually make people stronger - by working the problem. There is sometimes no example to follow and looking for solutions is sometimes high stakes. Parents are thankful for the District remaining calm and providing some structure and routine.

Assistant Superintendent of Business and Operations, Dr. Bruce Capron presented a budgetary presentation on the proposed 2020-2021 school budget. Dr. Capron spoke in terms of what the District knows today. All powerpoint slides are maintained as part of the BoardDocs packet. Property tax cap is 2.86% which will generate \$842,333. A \$200,000. average home value example was provided as a baseline for increased monthly taxes if voters approve the proposed budget. Almost always there are different tax rates among communities that make up HF-L. Dr. Capron highlighted that state aid formulas were maintained, while the District's foundation aid was reduced, however was offset by the CARES aid, so this keeps this category flat.

Appropriations were also discussed, and graphs provided. All may be viewed in the ppt presentation duly maintained as part of the BoardDocs packet.

Dr. Capron additionally highighted the following:

- The Capital Outlay Project was approved in December with a district investment of \$22,000.
- Budget balancing is accomplished this year with a combination of retirements, supply and contractual reductions

Questions/Comments/Answers

- C It is outstanding the way the District leverages state aid.
- C Internet connectivity the District is using less during the school closure? A Not necessarily, as much support is still provided by the District and BOCES/
- Q Is the District prepared for finals as far as connectivity? A Home internet settings will connect to servers and should not impact any crash of the systems.
- Q Can capital project funds be used for backup internet services? A No, unfortunately capital project funds cannot be used for these types of projects.

Superintendent Mancuso introduced newly appointed High School Assistant Principal, Scott Hassall. Mr. Hassall joins HF-L from the Sodus CSD and the Rochester Prep Charter School as a Social Studies teacher. Mr. Hassall loves the environment of being in a high performing school. Sodus had a different set of challenges, and he is looking forward to growing with HF-L. Excited for the opportunity.

Superintendent Mancuso invited Mr. Hassall to be a part of the interview committee of some upcoming hires. Welcomes were extended to Mr. Hassall.

Superintendent Mancuso spoke about his involvement in multiple committees with state and local leaders. The Governor's reopening Advisory Board presently has no educational representatives on their advisory board to re-open NY. There are so many unknowns with the upcoming budget vote, that efforts will continue to create pathways to make concerns understood.

Board Member, Stephanie Templeton extended appreciation and gratitude to the Honeoye Falls Fire Department for the celebrations this weekend. They will experience hardships without the Mendon Carnival this year.

Q - Are we doing okay with this? A - Every meal that the District gives away is reimbursed and is running on about half of the typical cafeteria staff. Some districts structured their contracts differently to pay holiday pay over the closure, however, HF-L did not. HF-L is serving approximately 50% fewer meals, and is receiving a great deal of assistance from other departments to support the delivery of these meals to the community.

Masks for employees, another concern regarding expense and is being discussed on the state levels.

NYSSBA has frozen their dues. There is a lot of talk about NYSSBA expenses over the last few months.
