OPPORTUNITY: RETURN TO INPERSON LEARNING

We're now one quarter of the way through the school year. Students who have been remote can choose to return to campus for in-person learning. Please contact Shannon Cordova at the Elementary or Elberta Rodriguez at the MS/HS.

EXTENDED LEARNING DAY

This Friday, October 8, is an Extended Learning Day for all grades. Your children should attend school according to their normal schedule.

Note: After-school programs will **not** be held on Extended Learning Days.

EXTENDED LEARNING DAY ABSENCES

Students who are quarantining due to exposure or a positive COVID test and who are participating in remote or online instruction are NOT considered absent. If a student does not log in to classes, they WILL BE considered absent. In order for students to be placed in remote learning for 10 days due to quarantine, parents or guardians MUST call the principal and submit a COVID test.

All Extended Learning Days are considered "regular" school days. Absences on these days are considered "regular" absences. Students missing more than 5% of school days, regardless of excused or unexcused absences, may require interventions, attendance contracts or referrals to external partners due to chronic absences



PISD will hold a job fair on Friday, October 8, 9:00-2:00 in the Jicarita Gym.



SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT: SUCCESS FOR ALL




Peñasco Elementary is excited for the return of one its most successful programs ever: Success for All. Many parents may have experienced the program when they were students. SFA teaches literacy and social-emotional skills. Students' reading levels are assessed so that their lessons are tailored to their needs. When PES had the program in the past, our school was considered a model for the entire program, and our students' reading scores were some of the highest in the state.

Our SFA Coordinator and Facilitator Michelle Esquibel has been working hard with our teachers to implement the program.

Students in lower grades are building their reading roots.











Students learn reading skills at increasingly higher levels.

Your child's school will be implementing Success for All.

What can you expect for your child?

Active and engaging instruction based on research-proven strategies

- The entire school will have a 90-minute reading block during which students are grouped according to their current reading levels.
- Children who are struggling will receive tutoring to help them catch up quickly.
- Children will be assessed at the end of each grading period on individual progress and then regrouped accordingly.

What will you be asked to do?

The Success for All reading program is designed to help parents and family members play active roles in their children's education.

- · You will be invited to participate with reading homework.
- You will receive more contact from your child's teacher about his or her progress in school.
- You might be asked to volunteer at school or attend special events.


What can you expect from teachers and school leaders?

To facilitate student success, teachers and school leaders will receive onsite coaching and assistance with goal setting, action planning, and student progress monitoring. You can expect:

- · engaging and interactive classroom materials for students to share,
- early recognition of how your child needs to be challenged to succeed in school,
- · frequent classroom grades and assessment results, and
- a behavior management approach that teaches children to think critically, solve problems productively, and work cooperatively in teams.

The mission of the Success for All Foundation is to develop and disseminate research-proven educational programs to ensure that all students, from all backgrounds, achieve at the highest academic levels.

These programs were originally developed at Johns Hopkins University.
