New Rochelle is a suburban city of 78,742, located along the shores of the Long Island Sound in southern Westchester County just outside of New York City. Programs and Highlights

- State of the art facilities that include a planetarium and the Museum of Arts and Culture which is the only Regents chartered museum in a school in New York State
- 30 Advanced Placement courses – 9 National Scholars in 2020
- The P.A.V.E. Program (Performing and Visual Arts Education) offers six areas of artistic discipline preparing talented students for postsecondary education in the Arts. Upon completion of designated theory and performance course work, students will earn a special Performing Arts endorsement on their high school diploma.
- 22 teams that include a two time state champion wrestler in 2019 and the NYS Class AA Varsity Football Champions in 2019
- Full and comprehensive business program consisting of marketing, accounting, business law and sports management. Students have potential for earning up to 9 college credits through dual enrollment courses
- Ignite is a student-to-student mentoring program designed to foster a positive school environment and help freshman make a successful transition to high school. Juniors and seniors receive extensive mentorship and leadership training and then are assigned to small groups of ninth graders for monthly peer meetings
- Five course sequence in architecture that utilizes the latest technology. Students have potential of earning up to nine college credits via dual enrollment courses and are eligible for a Career and Technical Endorsement on their diploma
- Science Research is an intensive four year program offering students the opportunity to conduct authentic science research, work in science labs during the summer and present research at various symposiums throughout the year
- 220 students each year take advantage of Career and Technical Education programs provided through Southern Westchester BOCES
- Language other than English courses from beginner to Advanced Placement available in Italian, French, Latin, Mandarin and Spanish

Covid-19 Statement / Class Rank

Due to school closures and changes in grading policies in 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, New Rochelle High School will not report an exact class rank. In 2019-2020 students had an option to receive a numerical grade or a P (pass) or an IN (incomplete) in courses not completed or passed. In 2020-2021 students received a numerical grade or an NC (no credit) in courses not completed or passed. New York State regents exams were waived for both years, reflected by E (exemption).

Grading Policy

Grading is on a 100 point scale. A passing grade is 65. Regents level courses are weighted 1.05. Honors, advanced placement and college dual enrollment courses are weighted 1.1.

College applications may explicitly ask students for their disciplinary history. For reference, New Rochelle High School does not send disciplinary information to post secondary institutions, however we counsel students to answer any related questions honestly.
