Take Flight was designed for:

- children with dyslexia seven years and older
- one-on-one or small group instruction (no more than 6 students)
- use by a Certified Academic Language Therapist
- four days a week sixty minutes per day for two years or
- five days a week forty-five minutes per day for two years

Five Components of Effective Reading Instruction

Take Flight contains the five components of effective reading instruction identified by research from the National Reading Panel. Take Flight addresses each component by:

- Phonemic Awareness following established procedures for explicitly teaching the relationships between speechsound production and spelling-sound patterns
- Phonics providing a systematic approach for single word decoding
- Fluency using research-proven directed practice in repeated reading of words, phrases and passages to help students read newly encountered text more fluently
- Vocabulary featuring multiple word learning strategies (definitional, structural, contextual) and explicit teaching techniques with application in text
- Reading Comprehension teaching students to explicitly use and articulate multiple comprehension strategies (i.e., cooperative learning, story structure, question generation and answering, summarization and comprehension monitoring)

Take Flight key findings include:

- Students that complete *Take Flight* instruction show significant growth in all areas of reading skill.
- Follow-up research on children who completed treatment indicates that students maintain the benefits of instruction on word reading skills and continue to improve in reading comprehension after one year.
