COURSE OFFERINGS FOR EHS

EHS exceeds the requirements of 38 courses by 170 courses for a total of 208. In addition, thirty-one (31) courses are offered at South Arkansas Community College.

21 Advanced Placement courses are listed in the EHS catalog and taught during the 2021/2022 school year.

Eight (8) concurrent courses are taught at EHS during the 2021/2022 school year.

WHAT IS EHS DOING TO MEET STATE AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS OF ESSA STANDARDS?

- 12. Requiring independent reading during the summer and then quarterly during the school year through English classes.**

- 13. Providing Teacher Leaders/Mentors in all subjects to 1st-3rd year teachers.**
- 14. Critical Reading to 9th and 10th grade students.**
- 15. Critical Algebra class**
- 16. ACT intervention**
- 17. Implementing the HUB program to increase graduation rate.**
- 18. Creating a 30 minute block of time 4 days per week to provide point in time RTI.**

RESPONSE TO INTERVENTION

CRITICAL READING:

Critical Reading is a reading class offered to 9th and 10th "In Need of Support" students who are below level in reading and who are missing essential literacy skills. Instruction includes *Reading Horizons*, an intensive reading intervention program.

CRITICAL ALGEBRA:

Critical Algebra is a class for students who need a little additional support in order to pass Algebra I.

CATS Time:

CATS is a 30 minute block of time 4 days per week for teacher led RTI or enrichment.
