

Sometimes young readers will get overwhelmed when they see a longer word. Help point out the prefixes and show them the base word.

For example if they see the word <u>misread</u>, break the word after '<u>mis</u>' and remind them this is a prefix and show them the base word '<u>read</u>' that they can sound out by 'r' sound, vowel team 'ea' that says e, and the 'd' sound.


