

## **22-23 Dyslexia Report**

2021-present: In 2021, Rose Bud School District began using the Wilson Reading System in small group intervention to address the deficit areas of students identified as exhibiting characteristics of dyslexia. During the 2019-2020 school year, RBSD adopted the Wilson Language Training programs, which are designed to create a multi-tiered system of support for all students. Many students who were previously receiving tier 3 intervention made progress and began receiving tier 2 intervention. Tier 2 intervention numbers are included in this total.

To make sure Wilson Language Training programs are taught with fidelity and as designed, teachers using the program have professional learning opportunities in alignment with the standards set out by Wilson Language Training®. Five certified teachers (Three Reading Interventionists and Two Special Education Teachers) at Rose Bud School District completed ninety hours of professional learning and a year long practicum; these individuals became certified providers of the Wilson Reading System.

- During the 2022-2023 school year, 92 students attending Rose Bud School District were screened and received dyslexia intervention services from a trained dyslexia interventionist.
- During the 2021-2022 school year, 79 students attending Rose Bud School District were screened and received dyslexia intervention services from a trained dyslexia interventionist.
- During the 2020-2021 school year, 90 students attending Rose Bud School District were screened and received dyslexia intervention services from a trained dyslexia interventionist.
- During the 2019-2020 school year, 81 students attending Rose Bud School District were screened and received dyslexia intervention services from a trained dyslexia interventionist.

- During the 2018-2019 school year, 83 students attending Rose Bud School District were screened and received dyslexia intervention services from a trained dyslexia interventionist.
