NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOM...

Preschool friends... Tick tock, tick tock...Hickory Dickory Dock the mouse ran up the clock. This week our friends in Preschool are learning this fun nursery rhyme. We learned how to move the hour hand around a clock to identify our numbers and introduce the fundamentals of telling time. We are also learning to identify the rhyming patterns in the story. Preschool is so much fin!

Kindergarten did MAP testing this week. We are learning and practicing new plain line letters i & u in Fundations. Along with reviewing our other plane line letters and skyline letters. We have been reinforcing the letters with letter crafts in the classroom. In math we are learning about more, less and equal to. We have been learning about respect and kindness through some activities and books.

First grade did a nice job reading their first Journeys story. In math, we learned how add to make the numbers 9 and 10. In Social Studies, we learned about the author Yuyi Morales. In Mrs. Gaffney's class, we started making Halloween crafts for our bulletin board. Some students took their iRead screener and began using their reading software. They were so excited to make their new "monsters" in Beastie Hall! We are continuing to work on letter recognition and sounds in Language Arts and number recognition and counting in math. This week we read some fun Halloween stories as well.

Second grade students Participated in the Week of Respect spirit week activities. We continued to learn ways to treat each other respectfully through the children's literature, and corresponding language art activities. Students listened to and discussed the following books: The Sandwich Swap, Interrupting Chicken, and The Bad Seed. Second graders created Expanding Math Monsters for our classroom bulletin boards. This cute critters helped students practice 3-digit place value and expanded form. Students also made Noun Witches for our hallway bulletin board. Students wrote paragraph to enhance their knowledge of nouns and how use them in their writing. Students in Ms. Levine's class are working on identifying and adding adjectives to their writing. In Reading students are working on their new stories in iRead and System 44, and are looking forward to their comprehension tests at the end of the week. Students have also been working hard on their new spelling lists. In math students continue to work on their addition and subtraction skills

Third grade is wrapping up their first chapter for math and is moving on to chapter 2, representing and interpreting data! Students are also beginning their clay landform projects in Social Studies. Students cannot wait to start designing their clay models which will include various landforms and bodies of water.

Fourth grade students finished up their Start Strong Testing! They worked super hard and their teachers are very proud of them. In math, the 4th grade is getting into multiplication! If you see a fourth grader, ask them a math fact. In reading, students started Lesson 3. The story is about how students get their library books in different countries. The students are also continuing to learn about the regions in New Jersey and the United States!

Students in Mrs. McCann's classroom are continuing their writing skills and have started editing, and focusing on topic and main idea. All of the students are participating in after school clubs, such as Choir and Art Club. We are focusing on homophones and writing and understanding an informative paragraph in our System44 program.

Fifth graders had fun this week learning about finding the theme of a story. They celebrated by having a glow dance party where they worked together in groups to figure out themes of popular songs! We loved seeing them show off their moves and come out of their shells! In math, we are remembering our order of operations while solving numerical expressions. "Please excuse my dear Aunt Sally!"

Students in Mrs. Milewski's class took the Start Strong ELA and Math assessments this week. In ELA class we are working on our new spelling words and our new System 44 stories: Weird Sport Records, Big Steals, and Wacky Attractions. In math class we are comparing numbers using Mr. and Ms. PACMAN.
